President's Message by Rick Matteson, President of Master Board

urora has declared a Stage 1 drought that will affect lawn irrigation practices throughout the city between May 1 and September 30. The city's goal is to reduce outdoor water usage by 20 percent by limiting watering to two days per week (down from three days per week last year).



General Manager Gene Blum is determining how this will impact HEB's needs for watering the golf course and common areas, and residents who own individual homes. Fortunately, the city recognizes that HOAs like ours, with large acreage to water, need some flexibility.

When the details are finalized, we will share those with all residents.

Congratulations are due to our community, as well as Director of Golf Jason Franke, Director of Agronomy Marty Savage and all of their employees who are responsible for our golf operations and course maintenance, as well as our Food & Beverage staff. The Heritage Eagle Bend golf course won the most CAGGY awards in our history in this year's Best of Colorado voting.



As Spring approaches, here are several reminders!

We are seeing vehicles left on streets at night. Please remember that vehicles need to be in garages at night (or on driveways if you live in a single family home or Traditions).

If someone has passed or you have married or changed your name, please email JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com or drop off the documentation to the Clubhouse or Admin Building M-F 9 am – 4 pm, for our records.

We continue to have complaints regarding dog waste, dogs off leashes etc. Remember we are in the City of Aurora and follow their rules with regard to number of dogs, dog breeds, dogs off leashes, immediately picking up after your dog, etc.

Additionally, trash should be put out after 5 pm on Wednesday for pick-up on Thursday. Also, please do not leave your cans at the top of your driveway.

Also, only those with driver's licenses can drive a golf cart. Please do not let your grandchildren drive your cart. It is dangerous to them and to our Residents. We wouldn't want someone to get injured.

When it comes to RV's, they can only be parked in front of your home for 48 hours.

At that time, they can be moved, with a permit from the Welcome Desk, to the Clubhouse Parking Lot for another 48 hours. At that time, they no longer can be stored in the Community.

Remember there is no parking in the drives of the Village units. These are Fire Lanes. All Village residents must keep their vehicles in their garages. Also, Visitor lots are for visitors and not resident overflow.

The operating results (subject to audit) for yearto-date February 2023 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$31,330 versus a budgeted surplus of \$30,542. However, we are watching our snow removal expenses as they have been high for this snow season. For February 2023 reserve net income shows an excess of \$41,935 vs budgeted surplus of \$40,304.

Aurora City Council recently declared a Stage 1 drought effective on May 1st, 2023. Despite recent news of above average snowpack levels, the three river basins Aurora draws its water from are currently at a combined 84% of average snow water equivalent. Between the snowpack, below normal runoff projections and current reservoir levels, Aurora believes a Stage 1 drought declaration is necessary to reduce demand in the city to help sustain stored water supplies. The upcoming irrigation season will be challenging because we will be restricted to watering two times a week versus the usual three times. Hopefully we will have a wet season.



Birds of a Feather Flock Together in the Craft Room by Sheryl Hutchings

7ith winter on its way out and spring bringing the promise of finally warmer and more "outside friendly" weather, the birds in our vicinity are returning. Robins, turtledoves, swallows, pigeons: they and many more feathered harbingers of spring are back in our midst. With that in mind, "Birds of a Feather" is the theme we have chosen for the April issue. You can see these paintings in person by visiting the craft room all during the month of April.

Pat Marden chose to share a painting with a lingering wintery motif. Her watercolor entitled "Red Beauty in Nature" expresses her love of beautiful red cardinals in the winter snow.

"Camouflage" is a pretty little watercolor bird "looking for a home," as its creator Cindy Tinkham Shepherd reports. The bird is perched on an acrylic background painted on canvas.

Alaine Lessing's whimsical watercolor entitled "Peeps" portrays an imaginary wildlife version of the sugary species often spotted in Easter baskets.

Elaine Tsumura sent in "Vividly Colored Wild Duck," a painting that depicts the North American wood duck, one of the most colorful of water birds, which nests in natural tree cavities and prefers swampy wooded areas. Elaine says, "You can always tell a wood duck by its red eye." She painted this watercolor referencing a photograph that her son took.

Sheryl Hutchings chose to paint a belted kingfisher. Kingfishers are native to North America, and in Colorado they can be spotted along rivers like the Big Thompson. They are one of the few species where the female is more colorful than the male, sporting a chestnut or rust-colored

band across her chest. "The beautiful mix of blue and black and white and rust is what led me to paint a watercolor version of this lovely bird on a watercolor poured background," Sheryl explained.

Karen Sorenson submitted "Eastern Blue Jay," an acrylic work inspired by one of her favorite birds. She is very familiar with this jay because while growing up on the east coast, she had many in her backyard. She sees them in Colorado as well. "While taking walks along Piney Creek, I have noticed many, very noticeable at their first call, then spotting them on a branch."

Lynn Kowalski is also drawn to blue birds. She sent in "Bright Blue Birds," using the technique of watercolor and sprinkled salt again to create a lively background for the very bright blue birds in the painting. Lynn says, "The painting reminds me of a lovely spring day!"

"Hens and Roosters" is a watercolor and acrylic work created by Marilyn Kardell, who commented that she is "looking for spring with birds singing and roosters crowing."

he Golf Advisory Committee (GAC) is sponsoring and managing a resident volunteer program to assist Golf Operations with maintenance on the course. The objective is to supplement the efforts of Golf Operations to maintain the quality and appearance of the HEB Golf Course at a high level.

The duties of the volunteers will mainly be to fill divots with sand on tee boxes and fairways, repair ball marks on greens, and other general housekeeping tasks required on the course. 

Please see the message below from HEB homeowners and their experience of how wonderful a place HEB can be to live. A note of thanks to our community- by Jill Taylor

I moved to Heritage Eagle Bend when I was 67 years old. For 67 years I had lived in neighborhoods. In a neighborhood, I typically knew about 20% of my neighbors well and I considered about 40 % acquaintances and then I didn't know the remaining 40% at all. That changed when I moved to Heritage Eagle Bend.

HEB is more than a neighborhood; it is a community. Living in HEB, I have found that each time I meet a resident, he/ she is a friend I hadn't yet met. Since we are all in the same or similar stage of our lives and the same or similar socioeconomic level, we have a lot in common even before we meet. We are fortunate to have a lot of friends in this community. It is a community of friends rather than just a neighborhood.

In October my husband, Bob Cartmell, and I went to Washington to celebrate our grandson's birthday. On the second day after we arrived, my husband became very ill. He was admitted to the hospital on October 23 and after five surgeries, two and one-half weeks in ICU, innumerable x-rays, CT scans and medications, he was discharged 8 weeks later. He was extremely ill. We were extremely lucky that he survived. Our son and daughter-in-law turned the lower level of their home into our apartment with a hospital room for my husband. Over eight weeks, he recovered slowly with physical therapy and IV nutrition. We were finally able to come home to Heritage Eagle Bend on February 16. We went on vacation for five days and returned four months later!

While we were gone, Janelle and Gary Mabie, Cynthia and Steve Hungerford, Deb and Don Roth and Glenn and Kathy Trice took care of our home. Since we had only planned to be gone for five days, we hadn't prepared our home to be gone for four months. From cleaning perishables out of the refrigerator, to keeping the battery charged on our golf cart and our car, watering the plants and lowering the temperature on our hot tub, among other things, our friends took care of us.

We want to thank the Heritage Eagle Bend community of friends for your cards, your text messages, your financial support, your prayers and your kindnesses. When we came home, there was a parade of about 75 people, mostly HEB residents, on our street to welcome us home. There were welcome home signs and balloons. We feel very loved by the HEB community.

Women's Golf Association

he USGA has published their 5 Key Changes in the most recent edition of the Rules of Golf, effective January 2023.

- 1. New Rule Modifications for Players with Disabilities. These modifications are now part of the Rules and are in effect for all competitions and all players who fall under the categories covered in new Rule 25.
- 2. Replacing Damaged Clubs. If your club is damaged during a round (except in cases of abuse) you may replace it, repair it or continue to use it.
- 3. Ball Moved by Natural Forces. When your ball is at rest after taking relief and then rolls into another area of the course due to natural causes, there is no penalty, and you must replace it.
- 4. Handicap on Scorecard (Stroke Play Only). You are not required to put your handicap on your scorecard and there is no penalty if you return your scorecard in a competition with an incorrect handicap, as this is now the Committee's responsibility.


5. Simplified Back-on-the-Line Relief. When using this relief option, you are required to drop your ball on the line, and it may roll up to one club-length in any direction.

Feeding Wildlife

Feeding Wildlife puts everyone at risk. We know people mean well when they give tidbits to wildlife. What many don't realize is that feeding big game is bad for the animals and dangerous for people. It's also against the law. When deer herds move to lower elevations closer to homes, some people may feel the deer do not have adequate food sources, but the contrary is true. Colorado Parks and Wildlife launches controlled, emergency feeding of big-game animals during extremely harsh winters.




