President's Message by Rick Matteson, President of Master Board

urora restrictions on lawn irrigation go into effect May 1 due to the city's declaration of a Stage I drought. We will eblast details of how the restrictions will affect watering practices throughout the community, but basically:



- Lawn irrigation will be restricted to two days per week. Individual homeowners with
 - even-numbered addresses will be allowed to water on Sunday and Thursday, and those with odd-numbered addresses can water on Wednesday and Saturday.
- Residential irrigation systems cannot water between 10

 a.m. and 6 p.m. The maximum number of days per week
 and daytime watering restrictions also apply to watering
 lawns with a hose or manual sprinkler attachment.
- Watering vegetable or flower gardens by hand is allowed between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- The Master Association, Traditions and Villages are working together to determine irrigation for common areas and residences in those sub-associations.
- Two existing wells these were the primary irrigation source for the golf course prior to installation of a city-owned water line – will be utilized to make up for a 20 percent reduction in golf course water supplied by the city.
- The city intends to enforce water restrictions with higher water rates for overuse, as well as fines for violating irrigation times. If you have complaints about violations, please direct those to the City of Aurora, not to HEB's administration office.

The city's actions, and what they might imply about future water resources, heighten the importance of HEB's plans to replace the current irrigation system on the golf course. Our goal is to significantly reduce the amount of water needed for irrigation and to be more efficient with what we do use. We expect to accomplish that through the design and technology of a new system, and a reduction in the acreage that we irrigate (we currently irrigate about 102 acres of fairways, greens, tees, roughs and driving range turf).

However, we are watching our snow removal expenses as they have been high for this snow season. For March 2023 reserve net income shows an excess of \$62,809 vs budgeted surplus of \$63,206.

RV'S !!!!

In 2017, a great deal of time was spent dealing with questions and issues surrounding RV's. Since then, we like to be prepared! Many who do not have RV's want to know what the restrictions are and those that do have RV's want to know what they should be doing. We ask all RV



owners to be mindful that you can only park in front of your home for 48 hours. Also, RV's can be parked with a permit at the Clubhouse parking lot for 48 hours. Please contact the Welcome Desk for a permit.

This is allowed for quick turn-arounds, not for any type of permanent parking. As most realize, there isn't much room in front of homes and it can be an inconvenience for your neighbors if you leave them beyond the 48 hours. On the other hand, the rules and regulations do allow RV's to park in front of homes and in the Clubhouse parking lot for resident convenience. Many of our residents enjoy RVing and we appreciate everyone being respectful of the 48 hour time frames for loading, unloading, de-winterizing and winterizing your RV's.

TIME FOR SPRING CLEANING AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

As Spring approaches, here are several reminders!

Spring is upon us, I know we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – With the watering restrictions in place by the city of Aurora, many homeowners are looking into alternatives for their homes' landscaping. This could be a great way to reduce water and is strongly encouraged by the City of Aurora. The city is offering rebates through their GRIP (grass reduction incentive program) program if, or when, you install water wise landscaping. Please contact the city of Aurora for more information or go to their website at https://www.auroragov.org/residents/water/ rebates/water-wise_landscape_rebate. The city is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB's Resident Improvement Guidelines for more information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of our 'RIGs' can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/AAC.

Radon Mitigation Systems – The request to install Radon Mitigation Systems in resident households has become very common in the Colorado area. The EPA and HEB's AAC encourages residents to have their homes tested for Radon, to see if mitigation is needed, and will work with anyone planning to install a Radon Mitigation System. Please contact Jillian at <code>Jwyatt@heritageeaglebend.com</code> for approved examples of Radon Mitigation Systems in the community.

Painting – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Book located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home's new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, ALL exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes, but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. POOL OPENING! MAY 26TH

We are looking forward to the outdoor pool opening later in May! Here are some reminders for the upcoming pool season that you need to be aware of

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

- 1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
- 2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
- 3. Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.
- No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed <u>only</u> in the Outdoor pool area.
- 5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
- 6. No smoking.
- 7. No pets allowed.
- 8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
- No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
- Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.

- 11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
- 12. Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
- 13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
- 14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
- 15. IMPORTANT: Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, while it is happening. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
- 16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.

Treescape / Tree Lawn Trees Replacement Process

he Residential Improvement Guidelines and Aurora City Ordinances requires at least one (1) tree in the treescape of each residential lot at a spacing of 30°. The only type of tree allowed in the treescape area are shade trees of 2 ½" caliper. In addition, the following should be noted:

- A. All residence's property lines extend from the rear yard to the back of the concrete curbing at the street. Homeowners own and are responsible for the maintenance of their treescapes.
- B. Treescapes must remain Kentucky Bluegrass and have a tree planted every 30 feet. If a tree dies in the treescape, it must be replaced in a timely manner at the expense of the owner. Note: some Xeriscaping is allowed by submitting a written request to the AAC.

To bring your Lot into compliance, a Shade Tree(s) of 2½" caliper must be planted in the treescape. The following trees have been preapproved for planting in the treescape area:

- Locust, Shade Master
- Locust, Sunburst
- Maple, Autumn Blaze
- Oak, Shumard
- Linden, Green Spire
- Oak, Chinkapin
- Maple, Crimson Sunset

The following trees are not allowed to be planted on any Lot within the HEGBC Community: Ash, Aspen, Cottonwood, Russian Olive, and Weeping Willow.

Replacement of the Treescape / Tree Lawn Tree is an Administrative Approval through the Admin Office, see instructions below:

Submittal Checklist:

- Email photo of existing treelawn / treescape tree to Jillian at JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com
- Include the type of tree you will be replacing it with from the list above
- Jillian will respond to email with approval to proceed as "maintenance"
- Email photo of completed tree planting

Please follow the advice of the nursery or landscape company installing the new tree about the best time to plant. It is OK to wait until Fall or Spring to plant the new trees, just let us know in your email to us.




