President's Message by Rick Matteson, President of Master Board

ur golf season finally is fully underway after what seemed like a long winter and then uncooperative spring weather that caused the course to endure a lot of short open/closed cycles.

Planning for replacement of the golf course irrigation system, which currently is scheduled for the 2026-2027 timeframe, also is well underway:



- Last fall, we contracted with iConGolf for overall design work. As the City of Aurora's current water restrictions indicate, water conservation is going to be a critical requirement and increasing necessity in future years. We currently irrigate more than 100 acres of fairways, greens, tees and rough; we expect iConGolf will identify areas where we can eliminate irrigation by reducing the playing surface. The firm also will focus on improving our bunkers and tee boxes. The proposed design will be shared with the community for input.
- The first step in that work will be preparing a detailed topographic contour map of the course. This will be done using a fixed-wing drone that will overfly the course for about five hours at a height of 200-400 feet. We will notify residents when that is scheduled.
- Next, the United States Golf Association will use its GPS tracking service to identify areas of high and low golfer traffic, and pinpoint where golfers hit from the most. More details will be available when this is scheduled, but basically golfers are asked to carry a device that tracks them along the course. Data is collected over two, three-day periods.
- The Board expects soon to hire a firm to design the irrigation system. To maintain our commitment to transparency with the irrigation project, and as we did with iConGolf, the contract will be approved at a Board meeting.
- The final and most expensive part of the overall project will be hiring a contractor for the actual installation work, and to work on bunkers and tees. It's uncertain how far in advance those firms are willing to commit to a contract, but we expect to begin exploring that phase next year. We feel that iConGolf and the company selected to design the irrigation system will be able to provide reasonably reliable estimates for the installation cost.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for year-to-date April 2023 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$59,637 versus a budgeted surplus of \$55,984. This month our communal water expense underran budget because the system was not turned on in April. For April 2023 reserve net income shows an excess of \$83,690 vs budgeted surplus of \$84,108. Starting with this month we will now be showing our Bank Balances and yield for our Working Capital and Reserve Fund.

DROUGHT MANDATE AND TREE/SHRUB REPLACEMENT

This was sent in an Eblast on April 30, 2023.

"You have received information in the mail from the City of Aurora Water Department regarding the drought and restrictions for water during Phase 1. Eblasts have also been sent to the whole community by the Master Association and by the Traditions Board."

If you call the hotline to get on the TEB tree and shrub removal/replacement list, you will be told the following:

"Before we spend \$ to replace your tree/shrub, you should know that it will be your responsibility to water the plant/tree including the winter months. If the plant dies due to water neglect, TEB will not replace it."

We ask all RV owners to be mindful that you can only park in front of your home for 48 hours. Also, RV's can be parked with a permit at the Clubhouse parking lot for 48 hours. Please contact the Welcome Desk for a permit.

This is allowed for quick turn-arounds, not for any type of permanent parking. As most realize, there isn't much room in front of homes and it can be an inconvenience for your neighbors if you leave them beyond the 48 hours.

On the other hand, the rules and regulations do allow RV's to park in front of homes and in the Clubhouse parking lot for resident convenience. Many of our residents enjoy RVing and we appreciate everyone being respectful of the 48 hour time frames for loading, unloading, de-winterizing and winterizing your RV's.

POOL OPENED!

The outdoor pool opened last month over the Memorial Day weekend. Here are some reminders for the upcoming 2023 pool season that you need to be aware of....

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

- ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
- 2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
- Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.
- No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed <u>only</u> in the Outdoor pool area.
- 5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
- 6. No smoking.
- 7. No pets allowed.
- 8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
- No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
- Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.

- 11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
- Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
- 13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
- 14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
- 15. IMPORTANT: Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, while it is happening. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
- 16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.

There Is a Time for Everything and a Season for Every Activity Under the Heavens by Sheryl Hutchings

s we transition from springtime into the summer months, "Seasonal Scenes" is the theme our group chose for this month's newsletter. The paintings submitted demonstrate "painterly" feelings about the various seasons of the year.

"Floating Downstream" is a watercolor work by Elaine Tsumura, who produced a painting reflecting all four seasons. She describes her painting by saying, "In Colorado, leaves are one of the primary indicators of the changing seasons. In the Spring, they are emerging buds, in Summer, they become vibrant green, in Fall, they display beautiful warm colors and in Winter, they are dried and decomposing."

Alaine Lessing's "Ten-in-One" is an abstract watercolor depiction of her Wyoming ranch. "I combined favorite aspects of six pastures plus four seasons to create a 'memory postcard' of ranching years."

All four seasons are also depicted in Lynn Kowalski's work entitled "Red Apple Tree in Seasons." Lynn reports that she was "inspired to do this little painting by a needlepoint I once saw at an antique store. I love the simplicity of the trees and how they show the changes in the seasons!"

Carol Taylor chose to share her watercolor entitled "Spring" which pictures brightly colored kites flying on a breezy spring day.

A watercolor painting by Karen Sorenson includes spring grape hyacinths, a favorite of hers for their color and smell, as well as dianthus and daisies. Karon has titled it "A Vase of Spring Flowers," and says she enjoys painting many different types of flowers.

"Exploding Color" is a watercolor embellished with ink by Christina Davis who described what led her to paint it. "When I visited my sister in Texas, she took me to the Dallas Arboretum and Botanic Garden, and I was blown away by the stunning display of all the spring flowers placed among the trees and winding paths of the gardens. I was so inspired by the amazing colors of the gardens, I wanted to see if I could capture the scene with my watercolors."

Roxanne O'Rourke was also in a spring frame of mind. Her painting, "Ethereal Tulips" is, according to her, "another example of beginning a watercolor painting by pouring streams of paint and inks across the paper, then spraying and maneuvering the paint. You can also "charge" certain areas to intensify the colors. I saw tulips forming in this one and went with it!

Pat Powell submitted "Spring Rush" a watercolor depicting the splendor of spring. Pat says, "After a long, hard winter, it was a delight to focus on new growth and vibrant colors."

"Nebraska Schoolhouse" by Cindy Tinkham Shepherd depicted the summer season in the midwestern plains, showing, "those hot windy days in summer that just feel like everything is just too much effort."

Sheryl Hutchings, who sent in "Fly Fishing Female" commented, "Although this last winter did seem a bit brutal, I do still love all the changing seasons in my native Colorado. That said, summer and autumn are, I think, my favorites. This watercolor painting of a female fly fisher, set against the backdrop of a late summer or early fall scene, is really a painting of a wish ...how I wish I could still go fishing!"

Pat Marden shared a winter scene entitled "Winter Window" that captures fond memories. "We love to visit the old, Red Lion Inn, in Stockbridge, MA during the Christmas season. We always stay in the same room, and one afternoon I was fascinated by the ice that had formed on one of the windows. I also love the old-fashioned wallpaper. This painting provides great winter memories."
