hile we still have a good portion of 2023 to enjoy, this is the time of year when the Board of Directors begins preparing for a new year. In September the Board will finalize a proposed 2024 operating budget that we will submit for your ratification. Here are a couple of key dates that I hope you will put on your calendar:



- Monday, October 2, 2 p.m.: First Town Hall in the Antero Room to discuss details of proposed budget.
- Wednesday, October 4, 5:30 p.m.: Second Town Hall in the Antero Room to discuss details of proposed budget.
- Thursday, October 5: Budget materials will be emailed to delegates, who will share with their residents.
- Thursday, November 2: Deadline for returning your ballot to your delegate.
- Tuesday, November 7, 5:30 p.m.: Budget ratification vote by delegates.

I hope you will attend one of the town halls; it is a good opportunity to learn about HEB's operations along with the budget details and to get answers to any questions you may have. I also hope you will take the opportunity to fill out your ballot and return it to your delegate, so that your personal decision is represented during voting. If you do not personally vote, your delegate will make that decision for you and cast your ballot.

November 7 also is election day throughout Colorado. Voters will be electing Aurora's mayor and city council members and area school board members. There also will be a number of ballot measures to vote on.

We invariably get questions about rules for campaign signs, so here are a couple of reminders:


- At HEB, you can display a maximum of two signs or flags (or one of each, but no more than two in total). That includes an American flag – that counts toward the total of two. That limit is contained in our community's Residential Improvement Guidelines (RIGs), along with details about sizes and placement of signs and flags.
- Colorado law specifically prohibits our Board and management from regulating the content and language on signs. While we hope everyone will exhibit reasonable taste in the language used, that is beyond our control.

If you plan to participate in the election process with signs or flags, please familiarize yourself with section 2.35 of our RIGs, which addresses this subject.

You can find the RIGs on our HEB website. In advance, all of us appreciate your cooperation with the RIGs that have been established by the community.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for year-to-date June 2023 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$101,689 versus a budgeted surplus of \$21,2002. We have lower expenses in communal water, landscape services and snow removal expenses. We are expecting higher expenses over the next few months as we turn on the sprinklers systems. For June 2023 reserve net income shows a surplus of \$12,073 vs budgeted

surplus of \$51,912. This underrun in surplus is due to the timing of some expenditures, which should correct itself over the next few months.

WATER WISE NEWS

Driving the streets of HEB you've noticed many water-wise projects in lawns and treescapes. There are three pre-approved design plans available at the Administration Building if you are interested in water-wise for your property. Three have plans for treescapes and lawns The fourth design is only for treescapes.

Your board, along with extensive help from the Conservation Ad Hoc Committee, is looking into a longrange plan for Traditions' properties. NO money has been set aside. We are taking baby steps in the process which has many requirements and participation from the City of Aurora, HEB Master AND Traditions homeowners that will have to be willing to agree on landscaping options. We will be discussing the financial and esthetic future of TEB, and if it fits into the overall look of HEB.

LANDSCAPING AND STRUCTURAL TREE TRIMMING

Our landscaper, SaBell's, has been very busy with irrigation issues. As a result, shrub trimming is about 2 months behind schedule. The list of addresses that have trees touching structures has been finalized and ArborScape will begin trimming this fall. Please call the hotline for any questions you may have.

Ed Doherty My wife and I have lived in HEB for 8 years now and have come to appreciate the dedication of the board




members, district delegates and other volunteers. In addition, we enjoy all of the benefits of living in such a wonderful community.



CAL Spells Out Its Need for Volunteers by Sheryl Hutchings, CAL Chair and Publicity Lead

The Center for Active Learning program here at HEB is a needs-based program. We hope you all get this message loudly and clearly: YOU CAN'T TAKE CAL FOR GRANTED. The program cannot exist without dedicated people who are willing to make it happen.

Volunteers are needed in several significant ways. 1. People willing to facilitate classes are **always needed**. 2. People who are willing to serve in flexible and limited curriculum development roles **will be needed** as 2024 approaches. 3. People who are willing to serve on the Lead Team in primary or secondary roles are **often needed** as lead team terms expire.

Please understand Need #1 first. At this point Fall Term is under way and the Winter Term is all mapped out, so now it is time to cultivate class possibilities for Spring of 2024. CAL needs class facilitators for that and future terms.

COURSE PROPOSALS FOR THE SPRING 2024 TERM ARE DUE JANUARY 10, 2024, so if you have a class in mind that you would like to facilitate, please take a minute or two to email Alice Edwards, Curriculum Lead, at AE5@aol.com and introduce yourself and your idea. Alice would love to hear from you. She spends so many hours all year round searching for and recruiting knowledgeable people in our community who are willing to share what they know in a CAL class. You can also visit the CAL website at calheb.org where you can find a class proposal form that you can download, fill out, and submit.

And what about Need #2? CAL is now looking for a few people to work closely with Alice on curriculum development. She reports, "We look for about a dozen classes each of the three terms to be presented by people who live in the community. One of the most fun parts of my job is meeting with people from HEB to find out more about them when they contact me to say that they might have an idea for a class."

If you are someone who loves learning and is interested in meeting people, you might really enjoy working with Alice, so please contact her at AE5@aol.com. Alice hopes to develop a small committee of volunteers who would be willing to help with recruiting, work with facilitators as they develop their classes, and complete other curriculum-related tasks. Alice estimates that, working alone, she spends 6 to 8 hours per day almost year-round meeting those goals. That is just too much to ask of any one person, and it is time to get other



people involved in curriculum development tasks. Please contact Alice to let her know you would be willing to serve in some capacity. She promises that terms of service would be short and flexible, and she will most likely kiss the ground you walk on if you agree to join her committee.

And finally, what's up concerning Need #3? CAL Leadership Team positions are currently for 3-year terms. Those positions are Chair, Publicity Lead, Curriculum Lead, Facilitator Lead, Registrar, Secretary, and Treasurer. Supplemental roles of Audio/Visual Coordinator and Zoom Coordinator are filled for undefined periods of time as those volunteers are willing and able to serve.

Fortunately, some wonderful volunteers have already indicated they are willing to step in to Lead Team roles as the terms of those currently serving expire. Donna Musciano has graciously volunteered to take over for Treasurer Phil Martin who will be stepping aside at the end of his current term in May of 2024. After training with Gary Pollard for the last year or so, Mary Williams will assume the position of Registrar when Gary steps down in May of 2024. Cindy Born-Mylo has volunteered to fill the role of Publicity Lead when Sheryl Hutchings retires in May of 2025.

And finally, in May of 2025, CAL will need to replace Alice Edwards as Curriculum Lead. The Curriculum Lead role is crucial to the success of the CAL program... it is that simple. The CAL program folds up like a cheap tent without a person in that position who is willing to do community outreach almost constantly to find people who will facilitate classes and guide them through the process.

Most of the time people think of CAL as an organization that meets the lifetime learning needs of the HEB community. Residents also need to think of CAL as an organization that has needs of its own, the primary one being residents who are willing to work in leadership or facilitator roles.




