President's Message by Rick Matteson, President of Master Board

The first day of Spring is still about a month and a half away, but we are getting ready for the principal parts of our 2024 Reserve Fund work.



As a reminder, the Reserve Fund is used to maintain and replace our community's physical assets. It is financed by a portion of our Master

Association HOA fees; the 2024 budget approved by residents allocates \$128 per month of our \$332 monthly fees to the Reserve Fund.

The major work this year includes:

- We have had Ground Engineering conduct a routine inspection of our HOA-owned retaining walls. While no significant issues were identified, some repairs are needed. Work will be done on several walls this year, with remaining work spread over the next couple of years.
- Road sealing will be done on parts of the west side of HEB.
- We plan to replace some of the kitchen equipment that is beyond its useful life. This is particularly important due to the significant increase we saw last year in Food & Beverage operations, particularly in our catering business.

In addition, as we have told you, our golf course irrigation system needs replacing and the bunkers and some tees need work. We have started the bidding process for the irrigation system work; a pre-bid meeting with potential vendors was held in mid-January. Soliciting bids for the bunker and tee work will be a separate process that we anticipate beginning later this year.

Thank you for your continuing support that makes it possible to maintain our community at a high level; all of us are looking forward to another great year in 2024.

REMINDERS TO HOMEOWNERS REGARDING DRIVEWAY RAMPS & SAFETY CONES

From the RIGs:

2.26a **Driveway Ramps.** Notification is required. It is allowed, with notification to Management, to install a driveway ramp. Any ramp must be professionally manufactured, not assembled lumber or planks.

As these ramps can interfere with curb-to-curb street snow pushing, it is preferred that they are removed by November 1st and not re-installed until May 1st. If an owner prefers to leave a ramp in place during snow pushing season, safety cones should be placed on each end when snow is present or expected and removed during clear weather. The property owner is responsible for any damage that occurs due to ramp.

We are noticing that safety cones are being left out even when the weather is nice, and snow is not expected. Please make sure to bring these cones in when the weather is nice.

If you are, out of town for the majority of winter, we ask that you please bring in the ramps for the winter before you leave. Your cooperation and understanding are much appreciated and helps keep our community looking beautiful and less like a construction zone.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We would love to have you.

RESPECT. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

GOOD LISTENING. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

THICK SKIN. Sometimes, residents even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

EGOS ASIDE. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

AGENDA ASIDE. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise?

SKILL. An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and team building backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There's no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community.

BLOOD DONORS STILL NEEDED THE NEXT COMMUNITY BLOOD DRIVE WILL BE FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2024

Thinking of making some new resolutions in 2024? How about becoming a blood donor. We'll make it easy for you – right here in Heritage Eagle Bend in the comfort of our beautiful Clubhouse. Contact Junegoddardcolorado@ gmail.com to ask questions or to make an appointment. Our first drive for 2024 will be held on Friday, February 23, 2024.

"Since the start of the pandemic, blood banks across the United States have been calling on eligible donors to come down and help stave off shortages. It's critical that blood banks have enough of a supply for local hospitals, which risk having to make hard choices about who receives immediate treatment and who must wait.

HOW MUCH BLOOD IS NEEDED IN THE UNITED STATES on a daily basis?

The American Red Cross says that <u>every two seconds</u>, a person in the United States needs blood and/or platelets, making it vital to have a lot banked. Blood is needed for everything from surgeries to traumatic injuries to cancer and sickle cell disease treatments, with roughly 29,000 units of red blood cells, 5,000 units of platelets, and 6,500 units of plasma required on a daily basis. Blood and platelets cannot be made synthetically, making voluntary donations necessary.

WHY ARE THERE BLOOD SHORTAGES?

Every year, only 3% of Americans donate blood, and at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, that number plummeted. Blood drives at schools and clubs were canceled and donor centers were closed, and because of staffing troubles and rising costs, things still haven't gone back to normal. In January 2022, the American Red Cross *declared its first-ever blood crisis*, after experiencing a 10% decline in the number of people donating."


WHY OFFER ZOOM CLASSES?

Zoom allows flexibility for both facilitators and students. Not only can facilitators use Zoom to teach from any location where computer and internet access exist, but they can also use Zoom to access to a wider pool of outside speakers. Guest speakers do not need to travel to us. They can enrich a class from afar and be a presence without being physically present.

Furthermore, if the clubhouse is closed for any reason, a class can still be held without having to be rescheduled, provided that the facilitator is comfortable with the use of the Zoom application and can make use of it from his or her home.

Art Club Embraces Different Strokes for Different Folks by Sheryl Hutchings

Workshops often lead members of our group to try different techniques in their paintings, so for February and March we have chosen the theme of "Different Strokes." In many ways, artists can transform a simple watercolor work into something more dramatic. Paintings you can see in the craft room this month and next demonstrate a variety of different strokes.

Pat Powell sent in **"Horse Sense,"** an acrylic collage. Pat departed from her usual style with this dramatic mixed media work which she began in a workshop. She says that this piece "was a fun, experimental time of painting and pasting."

"Bamboo," a watercolor painted on rice paper, is Elaine Tsumura's "different strokes" contribution. "When practicing Japanese and Chinese brush painting, one uses different brushes and uses different hand positions. This watercolor is an example of "different strokes" because the brush is held differently to achieve a variety of strokes. Black ink is used most often; however, I used my regular watercolors to paint the bamboo. I would need to practice many years before I would become proficient and capable of mastering the Asian brush painting techniques. However, it is always fun to experiment and try new techniques."

Christina Davis, a longtime oil painter, has been challenging herself to transition to watercolor painting as well. She sent in "Winter Beauty," a watercolor embellished with pen & ink. "This painting was inspired from a photo I took when I stopped to see this wonderful winter scene on my way up to Sapphire Point in Summit County. I loved the look of the fence line with the bright rusts and greens behind it, showing up against the white of the snow."

"Patchwork Watercolor," is a truly mixed media work by Sheryl Hutchings. She started with a watercolor painting of a vase of flowers that she cut

up and used the pieces as if they were scraps of fabric in a quilt-like pattern, adding scrapbooking paper, ink, and ribbon to create the impression of a quilt. "My great-grandmother made beautiful quilts out of scraps of fabric and flour sacks, so I thought I would try to emulate her skill by using some different strokes of creativity."

Roxanne O'Rourke shared "**Moon Over Metallic**," in which she experimented with a wide variety of media and painting tools. "To achieve our theme of 'Different Strokes,' I incorporated many means of applying paint to my canvas including rollers, palette knife, drips from a squeeze bottle, sticks, sponges, my fingers, and, oh yes, my brushes! In addition to acrylic paints, I used colored pencils, gesso, and Posca pens. I LOVE to experiment!"

Rosemary Melnick sent in an acrylic work called "**Red Eyed Tree Frog**." "This colorful little fella was hiding beneath branches, and we were fortunate to find him on a recent trip to Costa Rica. My usual subject matter is flowers, landscapes and sometimes songbirds, so this red eyed tree frog is a 'different stoke' for me."

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
