FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for year-to-date November 2023 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$135,642 versus a budgeted excess of \$8,256. We have higher revenue due to the higher return on our investments and irrigation rebates from the City of Aurora. We also have lower expenses in communal water, landscape services and snow removal expenses. For November 2023 reserve net income shows a excess of \$10,032 vs budgeted deficiency of \$9,478. With one month left in the year it is still projected that we will be ending the year in a very positive financial position which will set us up for the start of 2024.

Traits of Good Board Members

Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

RESPECT. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

GOOD LISTENING. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

THICK SKIN. Sometimes, residents—even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

EGOS ASIDE. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

AGENDA ASIDE. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise?

SKILL. An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and team building backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills and temperaments. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job. Fellow board members and managers can help you with the transition and train you on board responsibilities, current work, projects and hot issues.

Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There's no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community.





BLOOD DONORS STILL NEEDED THE NEXT COMMUNITY BLOOD DRIVE WILL BE FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2024

Thinking of making some new resolutions in 2024? How about becoming a blood donor. We'll make it easy for you - right here in Heritage Eagle Bend in the comfort of our beautiful Clubhouse. Contact Junegoddardcolorado@gmail. com to ask questions or to make an appointment. Our first drive for 2024 will be held on Friday, February 23, 2024.

"Since the start of the pandemic, blood banks across the United States have been calling on eligible donors to come down and help stave off shortages. It's critical that blood banks have enough of a supply for local hospitals, which risk having to make hard choices about who receives immediate treatment and who must wait.

HOW MUCH BLOOD IS NEEDED IN THE UNITED STATES **ON A DAILY BASIS?**

The American Red Cross says that every two seconds, a person in the United States needs blood and/or platelets, making it vital to have a lot banked. Blood is needed for everything from surgeries to traumatic injuries to cancer and sickle cell disease treatments, with roughly 29,000 units of red blood cells, 5,000 units of platelets, and 6,500 units of plasma required on a daily basis. Blood and platelets cannot be made synthetically, making voluntary donations necessary.

WHY ARE THERE BLOOD SHORTAGES?

Every year, only 3% of Americans donate blood, and at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, that number plummeted. Blood drives at schools and clubs were canceled and donor centers were closed, and because of staffing troubles and rising costs, things still haven't gone back to normal. In January 2022, the American Red Cross declared its first-ever blood crisis, after experiencing a 10% decline in the number of people donating."

New Year Brings New Learning Opportunities and Plans for Structural Changes

s we celebrate the end of 2023 and journey into 2024, CAL extends Happy New Year wishes to the entire HEB Community! We hope your holidays have been happy and that you are ready to enjoy a healthy, productive, and exciting new year!

CAL kicked off its new year at a very successful Winter 2024 Term Kickoff which took place on Tuesday, November 28, 2023, from 10:15 to 11 a.m. in the Antero Room. Fourteen class facilitators manned their stations to explain their various class offerings before registration opened for the entire community. If you weren't at the Kickoff, you missed your opportunity to mingle with your neighbors as well pick up a possible winning ticket for one of three \$25 HEB gift cards raffled off for free! Congratulations to the lucky winners!

Thanks to all of you who signed up to learn something new! A few classes filled up within an hour or two of registration's opening at 11 a.m., and all classes met their minimum seat requirements within the first 24 hours. Registration officially closed on December 5. You can visit CAL's dedicated website at www.calheb.org to view the complete schedule of classes if you have forgotten the time, place, and day of the class or classes for which you registered, or if you are wondering what learning opportunities you missed out on.

So...CAL is ready for Winter 2024 and the prep has already begun, as usual, for the 2024 Fall Term. The big news is that a major change to CAL's term structure will begin taking place in September of 2024 as we transition from a three-term quarterly structure to a two-term semester structure. The Fall 2024 term will be the traditional eight weeks in length, but the Winter 2025 Term will be a twelve-week term, beginning in January and ending in April. Classes won't be offered at all in May of 2025 when people turn their attention to outdoor activities, travel, and family events such as weddings and graduations. Then, in September of 2025 the Fall Term will begin and it will conclude after twelve weeks at the end of November.

The new two-term structure DOES NOT mean that CAL classes will be twelve weeks long. Within each term each class facilitator will decide for how many weeks his or her class meets. Some classes may be four weeks long, some six, some eight, depending on the facilitator's plan. And classes will start and end throughout the twelve-week term at different times to conveniently fit facilitators' schedules.

The CAL Leadership Team believes there are several advantages to adopting this new two semester structure. By starting the Winter Term a little later in January of 2025, registration can take place after the new year begins instead of before the holidays in December, thus freeing up the CAL Lead Team to

enjoy their holidays free of CAL duties. Another advantage of a two-term structure will be that only two different programs of classes will have to be



planned each year as opposed to the traditional three slates of classes, a task which was producing a tremendous workload for the entire team. Reducing the workload of the Lead Team will hopefully encourage more volunteers in the community to step in and fulfill roles as team members complete their terms and vacate their positions. Finally, a structure with two twelveweek terms will provide for more flexibility within each term for classes of varying time lengths.

Change can be scary, but most change is good in the long run. In the coming year, CAL is ready to embrace change and new beginnings in a variety of ways. Happy 2024 everybody!


COMMUNITY-WIDE DINNER GROUP FOR SINGLES AND COUPLES

Make a Choice to Love More Art in 2024! by Sheryl Hutchings

The HEB Watercolor and Beyond Artists want to wish everyone a Happy New Year! We so look forward to another year of painting together and producing works that we can share with the entire community. We also want everyone to know how much we appreciate the enthusiasm of the community for our artistic efforts. After wandering through the library or the craft room where our paintings are displayed, people often share glowing comments about our work, and that provides much needed encouragement to keep us putting our paint brushes to paper or canvas.

Sometimes we even sell a piece, and that's even more encouraging!

For our January display of artwork in the craft room, we decided to let artists make their own choice of a favorite painting to share, rather than asking contributors to stick to a theme.

Cindy Tinkham Shepherd says that one of her faves is a mixed media work she entitled "No Fear" because it allowed her to be free to experiment and try lots of different combinations and techniques. "I decided perfection is whatever I decide it is, so I had no fears of failure or not doing it 'right.' I love my colors and textures in this piece, as well as the movement in it.'

Sheryl Hutchings was in a similar frame of mind when she made her artist's choice. She explained, "Usually when I paint, I am working from a photographic reference of some sort or some scene I have in my mind, but occasionally, it's just fun to put down my favorite colors of paint and a generous splattering of water on paper, let them mix and run together, and see what comes to mind and begins to take shape. That is exactly what I did in this recent watercolor painting I call "Serendipity."

"The Force of Nature" is a larger than usual work by Roxanne O'Rourke. Roxanne says that "working on a larger scale is sometimes very challenging. Oil was my choice of medium for this painting. I was pleased with the results."

Rita Summers sent in "Mountain Lion," a watercolor favorite of hers. Rita, who has traveled extensively to photograph wildlife, commented, "I almost always paint from my own photographs. Cougars photographed in other seasons are nice, but I thought this one stood out beautifully from the snowy background."

A travel scene was Christina Davis's choice to share. She calls her watercolor and ink painting "Portofino Alley" and says, "Portofino was a fascinating place to visit, and I loved exploring all the winding streets and seeing all the colorful buildings, many with laundry hanging out to dry across windows. Such scenes were wonderful inspirations for several works that I painted after my trip to Italy."

Inspiration for Alaine Lessing's contribution was closer to home. She sent in "Ray's Place," a watercolor. "January in Denver means it's time for National Western Stock Show, a venue for connecting with the agricultural community. Ray is a longtime farrier in Elbert County, where hints of the Old West still remain," according to Alaine.

The title of Lynn Kowalski's painting is "Golden Snowflakes." Lynn says, "The beauty of snowflake patterns led me to make this very snow-inspired picture. I used a salt and watercolor technique to create a snowy background for the snowflakes, which I painted with blue and gold metallic watercolor."

"Fire Dragon," Elaine Tsumura's choice, is an acrylic mixed media work "created with poured acrylic paints with the addition of various mulberry papers, tissue paper and spackle texture on canvas. 2024 is the Year of the Dragon. Those born in the Year of the Dragon are considered fortunate, for the dragon represents the greatest celestial power. Happy New Year to all HEB residents!"

Linda Ault shared an oil painting entitled, "Flowing Fuchsia Flower." She says, "This is a still life of pretty flowers flowing from a bean jar with an old serving tray in the background. It's painted on a large canvas, and I really like the how the oil medium allowed for bright pinks and magenta to blend well."



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
