the bids that were submitted for replacing the aging irrigation system on our golf course. This was a good start, but we believe there are additional opportunities to lower the construction cost to our community. As a result, we are going to conduct another round of bidding later this year.



Our Director of Agronomy, Marty Savage – who has experience with major golf irrigation projects – and our irrigation design consultant (Luarca Rodgers Design Group) are exploring a number of options.

For example, we are considering the feasibility of a different configuration of pumps and pipe sizes, which could achieve significant savings. There also may be cost efficiencies by selecting a single company to perform both the irrigation work and renovation of the bunkers and tees, rather than bidding those two pieces separately.

We anticipate the next round of bidding will take place in the August time frame, when the engineering and design work for bunkers and tees will be finished. We will continue to keep you informed as we make progress.

On a different note: It has been a privilege to serve as President the past four years. I am beginning the sixth and final year as a member of the Master Board (we are limited to two consecutive three-year terms). I have long said that when this time arrives, it is important to help facilitate a smooth leadership transition by choosing a new president.

At our April Board meeting we will elect officers for the next 12 months. I am very happy that Rex Gambrell has agreed to serve as our next President. Rex has a great deal of experience with HOA communities and management companies, as well as a deep commitment to HEB. I look forward to serving alongside Rex and my other Board colleagues for the next year.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for February 2024 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$13,123 versus a budgeted excess of \$3,832. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year, however we are always keeping an eye on our snow push expenses. For February 2024 reserve net income shows an excess of \$46,655 vs budgeted excess of \$44,118.

IRRIGATION

The communal irrigation system is scheduled to start running sometime after May 1st. The timing will

depend on the amount of rain we receive through April and May.

The Board has contracted with a new company ET Irrigation Company to run the controllers and maintain the communal irrigation system. ET is a local company which specializes in irrigation services and grass conversions. They have been in business for over 14 years and currently have successes reducing the amount of water used to maintain yards for our neighbor Tallyn's Reach and Castle Pines Metro Districts just to name a few. SaBell's has been retained to do all landscape services to include mowing, spring and fall cleanup services, etc. SaBell's will also remain as the irrigation vendor for the 92 homes with individual systems.

The Boards belief is that we need to reduce our water usage and ET has shown that they have achieved this goal for other communities.

The pressure from the Water Department to control water usage will only increase and we need to have a plan to stay in compliance, save water, maintaining a beautiful community while controlling our budget.

Heads up, TEB homeowners! If your house is on the list for a fresh coat of paint this spring, watch out for emails detailing start dates and how to get ready for a 2024 painting schedule. Let's paint the town... or at least your home!

SAVE WATER - SAVE YOUR MONEY - SAVE THE PLANET

The City of Aurora continues to promote water conservation and the transition of residential lawns and plantings to species that are appropriate to the semi-arid climate in Colorado. They are providing subtle motivation to homeowners through ever increasing costs for water through the Aurora Water utility (10 % increase this year alone).

We are looking forward to the outdoor pool opening later in May! Here are some reminders for the upcoming pool season that you need to be aware of

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

- 1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
- 2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
- Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.
- No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed <u>only</u> in the Outdoor pool area.
- 5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
- 6. No smoking.
- 7. No pets allowed.
- 8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
- No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
- Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.

- 11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
- Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
- 13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
- 14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
- 15. IMPORTANT: Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, while it is happening. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
- 16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.

TIME FOR SPRING CLEANING AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

As Spring approaches, here are several reminders!

Spring is upon us, I know we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – Waterwise landscaping is becoming more and more common. The city of Aurora is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB's Resident Improvement Guidelines for pre-approved designs and information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of the HEB RIGs can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/ AAC.

Statues & Yard Art – Only one statue is permitted per front and back yard and cannot exceed 5 ft in height. All yard art requires prior approval from the AAC. Only 1 bird bath is permitted on any lot.

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, empty pots, ladders, gardening tools etc. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Mulch – Mulch breaks down over time and requires replenishment every 1-2 years. Make sure to take a look at your landscaping beds to see if they need a refresh of mulch.

Artificial Flowers - Artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Painting – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Ring located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home's new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, ALL exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. We thank you in advance for all your hard work in keeping your home and out community a wonderful place to live!

RV'S !!!!

any who do not have RV's want to know what the restrictions are and those that do have RV's want to know what they should be doing. We ask all RV owners to be mindful that you can only park in front of your home for 48 hours.



Also, RV's can be parked with a permit at the Clubhouse parking lot for 48 hours. Please contact the Welcome Desk for a permit.

This is allowed for quick turn-arounds, not for any type of permanent parking. As most realize, there isn't much room in front of homes and it can be an inconvenience for your neighbors if you leave them beyond the 48 hours. On the other hand, the rules and regulations do allow RV's to park in front of homes and in the Clubhouse parking lot for resident convenience. Many of our residents enjoy RVing and we appreciate everyone being respectful of the 48 hour time frames for loading, unloading, de-winterizing and winterizing your RV's.

For a landscape request, you'll submit the following:

- AAC forms
 - including signatures from neighbors, at least 1-2 must sign (emails from neighbors acknowledging the project can be included with the forms and information)
 - ° initial all areas on the forms (no check marks)
 - ° include details of project
- Plot Plan
- ° drawing on location of requested improvements
- Photo(s) of existing areas you wish to change
- Additional information such as:
 - Size, dimensions, accurate drawing of changes, plants, materials, etc.
- Any additional information helpful to the AAC in their review process



DID YOU KNOW?

USGA Rule 5.6b emphasizes - <u>maintaining a prompt pace of play during a round of golf.</u> A round of golf is meant to be played at a prompt pace. Each player should recognize that their pace of play is likely to affect how long it will take other players to play their rounds, including both those in the player's own group and those in following groups.

Here are the key points: Play Continuously: Golfers should play continuously and without unnecessary delays throughout each hole until the round is completed. – Time Limit for Strokes: When it's a player's turn to play, it is recommended to make their stroke in no more than 40 seconds, and ideally even faster. - Playing Out of Turn (Ready Golf): In stroke play, players are encouraged to play out of turn in a safe and responsible manner. If you are the first to get to your ball, go ahead and hit.

OH YEAH did you know that Over 300 million golf balls are lost or discarded each year in the U.S.

As always stay safe and let's have a great 2024 golf season and help leave the course in better shape than you found it!

PICKLEBALL SKILLS TIP: A LEGAL PICKLEBALL SERVE:

- » The server's arm must be moving in an upward arc when the ball is struck.
- » Paddle contact with the ball must not be made above waist level.
- » The head of the paddle must not be above the highest part of the wrist at contact.
- ✓ A 'drop serve' is also permitted, in which case none of the elements above apply.
- At the time the ball is struck, the server's feet may not touch the court or outside the imaginary extension of the sideline or centerline and at least one foot must be behind the baseline on the playing surface or ground behind the baseline.
- ✓ The Serve is made diagonally crosscourt and must land within the confines of the opposite diagonal court.
- Only one serve attempt is allowed per server.

With the new 2024 season beginning the HEB Pickleball Club will be introducing a new Level-Setting process to help players determine their play-level assignment. This will ensure players are paired with other players of similar skills, promote a competitive, fun, friendly game among each playing group, and provide a positive experience no matter what play level.
