You may have also noticed that several retaining walls throughout HEB are being rebuilt or repaired and soon pavement crack sealing will take place where necessary.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for March 2024 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$19,322 versus a budgeted excess of \$5,748. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year, however we are always keeping an eye on our snow push expenses.

For March 2024 reserve net income shows an excess of \$69,915 vs budgeted excess of \$65,177.

The exterior painting project at TEB Homes went smoothly, with all 57 homes scheduled for painting in 2024 finished according to schedule.

IRRIGATION

The Board has contracted with a new company, ET Irrigation, to run the controllers and maintain the communal irrigation system. ET is a local company which specializes in irrigation services. ET has been in business for over 14 years. They have reduced the water used to maintain yards for our neighbor Tallyn's Reach and the Castle Pines Metro District. SaBell's has been retained to do all landscape services to include mowing, spring and fall cleanup services, etc. SaBell's will also remain as the irrigation vendor for the 92 TEB homes with individual systems.

The Board's belief is that we need to reduce our water usage. The pressure from the Water Department to control water usage will only increase and we need to have a plan to stay in compliance, save water; maintaining a beautiful community while controlling our budget.

POOL IS OPEN!

The outdoor pool opened last month over the Memorial Day Weekend. Here are some reminders for the upcoming 2024 pool season that you need to be aware of

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

- 1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
- Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
- 3. Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.
- No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed <u>only</u> in the Outdoor pool area.
- 5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
- 6. No smoking.
- 7. No pets allowed.
- 8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
- No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
- Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.

- 11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
- Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
- 13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
- 14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
- 15. IMPORTANT: Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, while it is happening. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
- 16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.

SUMMERTIME YARD MAINTENANCE AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

Summer is here and here are several reminders!

Summer is here and we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – Waterwise landscaping is becoming more and more common. The city of Aurora is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB's Resident Improvement Guidelines for pre-approved designs and information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of the HEB RIGs can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/AAC.

Statues & Yard Art – Only one statue is permitted per front and back yard and cannot exceed 5 ft in height. All yard art requires prior approval from the AAC. Only 1 bird bath is permitted on any lot.

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, empty pots, ladders, gardening tools etc. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Mulch – Mulch breaks down over time and requires replenishment every 1-2 years. Make sure to take a look at your landscaping beds to see if they need a refresh of mulch.

Artificial Flowers - Artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Painting – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Ring located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home's new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, ALL exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. BLACK HAWK

If by chance you have visited the Clubhouse on a Thursday morning around 9:00am you may have run into a gathering of residents in the foyer. Their volunteers are very knowledgeable and will help you with any question about your family search. If you haven't been there, try them out! They are a fantastic resource. DID YOU KNOW?

- » The insurance companies that underwrite hole-in-one contests figure the odds of a pro making a hole-in-one are 3,000 to 1. For amateurs, it's 12,500 to 1. We average 2 3 per year during MGA play!
- » According to studies by the USGA and R&A, the average length of drives for amateur golfers across all levels is 215 yards. For amateur women golfers, drives average 147 yards. Meanwhile, in 2022-2023, Rory McIlroy averaged 326 yards on his drives. On the LPGA Tour, the longest hitters averaged 285 yards. No wonder the pros often seem to be playing a different game than ordinary golfers.

Pickleball HEBGC PICKLEBALL COURT ETIQUETTE

- Arriving to Play Arrive on time. Avoid passing through occupied courts to get to your assigned court. If all courts are in use, wait in the pergola area until your scheduled play time, before entering the fenced area. If you arrive early and there is an empty court that you would like to use, navigate quickly and quietly to the available court without disrupting play on other courts.
- Pergola Area During Level Play, leave your bags and belongings in the pergola area outside
 the courts. This is also the area where players must wait their turn to rotate into play.
- Paddle Stackers During Level Play, use paddle stackers if 5 or more players are waiting to play. Paddle stackers are in the bin near Court 4. Hang paddle stackers outside the fenced courts in the Pergola Area. Instructions for using the paddle stackers are on the bulletin board outside the courts. Please put the paddle stackers back in the bin after use.
- Empty Courts If, during Level Play, there is an empty court, "slide" to the farthest court, leaving the court closest to the Pergola area available, so that your game is not interrupted if the next group of scheduled players are arriving early to play.
- Entering & Leaving Courts If you must walk across a court area where play is in progress, wait until the rally is over and ask to "pass through." Do so as quickly as possible, making sure gates are closed behind you.
- Respect all Players No offensive language and/or profanity. Exhibit good sportsmanship
 and integrity. Avoid arguments, disagreements, heated exchanges, or angry acts of
 unsportsmanlike conduct.

Here are the details for 2024:

- Play will take place on the front 9 holes and will be limited to 64 players per week, with a waiting list formed after 64 have signed up.

- If you sign up to play for the week on the invitation, you must also send a "Message

- If you are not currently on the Golf Genius app for W9D, please send your name, email address, and phone number to Jason Franke or Lynn nelson to be included on the emails for W9D.
- Deadline to sign up for play and buffet is 5:00 pm on the Monday before that Wednesday's play.
- Foursomes will be sent out from the Golf Shop before the afternoon of checkin. You will be with your playing partner each week (unless you're signing up as a single), but your twosome will be with a different twosome most of the time in order to play with different people.
- Check-in will begin at 4:00 pm the day of play on the patio outside the Pro Shop. We will collect \$3 per person for those who wish to be included in the prizes and drawings for that night. You can win only once on a given night and you must be present and have contributed \$3 in order to win a prize.

Lynn and Hal Nelson will continue to run the group this year, but the Golf Shop will help administer weekly operations. Please reach out with any questions. Since this is a new arrangement for our golf scramble, there will be a learning curve for all of us. Please be patient as we fine-tune the process to make it a pleasant experience for everyone. CLUB RULES, SAFETY GUIDELINES

- ✓ Games begin serve from the EAST side of courts. During play, when a team is ahead with a score of 6 points, players may change sides at the request of either side if all players agree.
- ✓ Before serving, the server should make certain the receiving team is ready. The serving team must call the score loudly enough for all players to hear. If there is a mistake in the score, wait until play is over to dispute the score.
- ✓ Do not call faults that occur on the other side of the net, unless asked to do so. It is the responsibility of the receiver's side of the net to make the line calls. Call all balls fairly. If you and your partner disagree on a call, the call will go to your opponent.
- V Non-Volley Zone (Kitchen) Faults All volleys (before the ball bounces) must be initiated outside of the non-volley zone. A fault will be declared if, in the act of volleying the ball, a player or anything contacting the player, including paddle or clothing, touches the non-volley zone. Any of the players may call the fault. The call goes to the opponents of the faulting team. NOTE: The line separating the NVZ from the service box is considered part of the NVZ.
- ✓ If a player commits a foot fault, or steps on the service line while serving, any player may call the fault but play resumes and a serve can be replayed in recreational play. During a club tournament, foot faults will result in loss of serve for that server.
- ✓ If a ball from another court rolls onto your court, or if your ball goes onto another court and is clearly a hazard to the nearby players, call out "BALL" loudly enough for all players to hear and stop play immediately. DO NOT smack the ball or roll it back to the court it came from, pick up the ball and return it to a player from that court. If you are waiting for a ball to be returned to you, hold up your paddle or hand to indicate that you are waiting for the return of the ball. IF the ball simply rolls by the back fence, wait until play ends or pauses to retrieve the ball. DO NOT interrupt play, if there is no safety issue.
- ✓ Court shoes are required during playing on our Pickleball Courts. No leather-soles, sandals, flip-flops, or bare feet.
