Please be sure to fill out your ballot and return it to your delegate, so that your decision is represented during voting. If you do not vote, your delegate will make that decision for you and cast your ballot.

November 5th is election day. We invariably get questions about rules for campaign signs, so here are a couple of reminders:

- At HEB, you can display a maximum combination of three signs and/or flags. An American flag counts toward the total of three. That limit is contained in our community's Residential Improvement Guidelines (RIGs), along with details about sizes and placement of signs and flags.
- Colorado law specifically prohibits our Board and management from regulating the content and language on signs. Of course, we hope everyone will exhibit reasonable taste in the language used, however, that is beyond our control.

### **FINANCIALS**

The operating results (subject to audit) for June 2024 are complete. The net result is an overrun of \$26,249 versus a budgeted overrun of \$15,605. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year except for snow push expenses. The snow push expense was higher than expected due to the 20 inches of snow we received over two days in March. We will be overrunning the budget item for this expense for the year. For June 2024 reserve net income shows an excess of \$24,791 vs budgeted overrun of \$64,046. This difference is caused by a timing of expenses that will correct itself over the next few months.

# Lamp Posts, Lightbulbs, Mailbox Posts & Numbers, and Mailboxes


Thank you to those who have freshened up your lamp posts, mailbox posts, mailboxes, house numbers, and replaced light bulbs. These items make our community look great. In case you do not know the colors for these items, please see below:

Lamp Posts: The color for the lamp posts with the original builder installed fixtures is Rustoleum Rusty Metal Primer

**Lightbulbs:** The only bulb to be used is a maximum of 60 watt or equivalent size in soft white.

Mailbox Posts: The stain for the mailbox posts is a Sherwin Williams stain called "SW 3512 Cider Mill".

House Numbers for Mailboxes: Mailboxes must have the home address in 1½ to 2 inches high white reflective vinyl numbers attached to the front lid.

# **FALL CLEAN UP!**

# As Fall approaches, here are some reminders!

all is upon us, and with the colder weather approaching, we know people are beginning to think about prepping their homes for the upcoming seasons. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the colder weather and keeping the exterior of your home neat and well maintained:

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, ladders, gardening tools etc. Empty pots must be rid of dead plants, as well stored out of site. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Leaf Clean-Up – Make sure to take a look at your yards once the trees shed their leaves, and be sure to rake and bag any fallen leaves. Please do not blow them into the streets.

Artificial Flowers – As much as we may start to miss our summer flowers, artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Tree Trimming Reminder – If your trees in your Tree Lawn (area between sidewalk and street) have over-hanging branches on the sidewalks or streets, please be certain to have them trimmed at your earliest convenience. Please note per City of Aurora, trees must be trimmed to a minimum height of 8 feet above sidewalks, and a minimum of 13.5 feet above streets.



As a reminder, <u>ALL</u> exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. # A DAY AT BLACK HAWK

f you have taken one of our regular trips on the "HEB Express" to enjoy a fun day at Bally's Casino, you might have wondered about the history of this little old Western town. Thanks to the Gilpin Historical Society,



history buffs will discover there's much to learn about and explore in Black Hawk and neighboring Central City.

If you want to take a break from the slots, there is a free shuttle running between Black Hawk and Central City. The Gilpin History Museum in Central City has about 18,000 artifacts from the area's gold mining history and other unusual displays. The story began on May 6, 1859, during the Pike's Peak Gold Rush, when John H. Gregory found a gold-bearing vein in Gregory Gulch between Black Hawk and Central City.



Within a couple months more veins were discovered. By 1860, as many as 10,000 prospectors had flocked to the town, then called Mountain City. But most left after finding no gold, so the population was only 3,114 people by 1900.

As the boom slowed and the hard work of extracting gold began, the remaining population began to form more organized towns. At the bottom of Gregory Gulch was Black Hawk, then called Black Hawk Point. The town took its name from the Rock Island, Illinois, foundry that produced one of the earliest stamp mills brought into the district. Black Hawk was incorporated by the territorial legislature in 1864. But the future started to look bleak when rich surface veins began to play out and Black Hawk's first smelter was unsuccessful. But three years later, the Boston & Colorado smelter opened, and the industry was revitalized.

In 1872, the Colorado Central Railroad line reached Black Hawk making it possible for coal to be shipped to the smelters and mills and supplies to be delivered to the mining towns. Despite many environmental disasters the towns continued to grow. Many of the miners were immigrants from Ireland and England, as well as a small band of Chinese miners. When Colorado was admitted to statehood in 1876, the entire Congressional delegation to Washington, DC, came from the Black Hawk area. Population peaked at over 1,500 in 1880 but started to decline in the early 20th Century and the population fell to 250.

Casino gambling was introduced in both towns in the early 1990s, but it has been more successful in Black Hawk, which now has 18 casinos, generating seven times more gambling revenue than Central City. Tax from the gambling revenue provides funding for the State Historical Fund, administered by



the Colorado Office of Archeology and Historic Preservation.

For more information on Black Hawk history join us on the HEB Express and visit the Gilpin History Museum, 228 E. First Street in Central City, just a short shuttle ride from our bus stop in Black Hawk.
