2024. Financially every area of HEB met or exceeded their budget.

Now that 2025 is upon us I want to share our Replacement Reserve spending plan for the year.

As a reminder this fund is financed by a portion of your monthly Master Association HOA dues and is used to maintain and replace the community's physical assets.

A little over 2.5 million dollars will be contributed to the replacement reserve fund in 2025 and approximately \$680,000 is planned to be spent throughout the year on replacement reserve items. The planned work for 2025 is significantly less than some years since many items have already been completed or are planned to be completed in upcoming years. In 2026 the golf course irrigation, bunkers and tees project will begin sometime in fall. That of course will be a significant project that is currently listed in the Replacement Reserve Study. Sometime in 2025 the Replacement Reserve Study will be updated. Prior to the time that the study has been completed more firm numbers for the Irrigation, Bunkers and Tees project will have been received and a contractor selected. So an updated more up to date number will be in the study. We will have further updates to the project as they become available throughout the year.

Thank you for your continuing support that makes it possible to maintain our community at a high level; all of us are looking forward to another great year in 2025.

2025 BUSINESS PLAN

Homeowners are reminded that the 2025 Business Plan is now in effect. The Traditions HOA plan can be downloaded from the Resident section of the Heritage Eagle Bend website in the Traditions HOA section.

CORPORATE TRANSPARENCY ACT

Traditions HOA is complying with changes to Federal Law related to the Corporate Transparency Act though the services of the Altitude Community Law firm.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for October 2024 are complete. The net result is an

underrun of Net Income of \$62,022 versus a budgeted underrun of \$64,291. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year except for snow push expenses due to the 20 inches of snow we received over two days in March and November. We expect the November invoice to be paid for in the December results. However, we are underrunning communal water expense which will somewhat offset the higher snow push expense. For October 2024 reserve net income shows an overrun of \$133,549 vs budgeted overrun of \$33,810. We have had higher irrigation controller's and gutter, and downspouts expenses this year. These expenses have been somewhat offset by higher returns on our investments.

NEED FOR BOARD MEMBERS

It's fun, it's easy to do, it doesn't take much time, you form great friendships, you contribute to better the community. What more could you ask? The Traditions HOA board would like to appoint new members during 2025 (no election required to serve an appointment). This will give new members an opportunity to make the Traditions HOA, and the community, better and stronger. Members have found that participation decreases their age by at least 10 years. NEW YEAR, NEW ASSESSMENTS! NEW PAYMENT METHOD!

Below are the 2025 Assessment amounts due on the 1st of the every month.

HEB Master Association (all homes in HEB) - \$348.00 monthly Village Sub-Association (townhomes) - \$315.00 monthly Traditions Sub-Association (duplexes) - \$233.00 or \$190.00 monthly*

*Note: 92 Tradition homes on E. Kettle Pl, S. Buchanan Way, and E. Mineral pay individually for their own exterior irrigation water, thus their dues are \$177/month. The other 279 homes pay \$220/month which includes exterior irrigation water.

If you were previously set up on autopay with the HOA, you will need to reset up your payment method as the financial platform that was used for autopay will no longer be active effective 12/31/24. Here are the payment options available:

<u>Pay Online – One Time or Recurring Payments</u> The new online payment system FRONTSTEPS -https://quickpay. frontsteps.com/?mgmtid=5063. On this system you can complete one-time payments or set up autopay using ACH or your credit/debit card. You will need your account number to set this up. If you do not have your account number please call the Admin Building at 720-235-1827. With this new online system payment transactions will incur the following convenience fees:

• \$1.99 for ACH Payments

• 3.5% for debit and credit card payments

Automatic Bill Pay

Set up bill pay through your bank. Many banks offer automatic bill pay for their customers. Bill Pay is a service offered by the bank where they deduct the payment amount from your account, cut a check, and mail it to the vendor on your behalf. Interested Candidates: The 2025 election for two (2) seats will take place in April. Each term will be for three (3) years. A prospective candidate must own a home in Heritage Eagle Bend Golf Community (and be on the deed) and their HOA account must be/remain current.

Applications will be available at the Administration Building (Not the Clubhouse) or by an email request to Jillian Wyatt, Community Manager, JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com

Candidates may begin submitting their applications, a brief biography (not to exceed 250 words) and a color picture.

Deadline for submitting applications will be February 21st, 2025.

Any application received after February 21st, 2025 will not be accepted. After this date, anyone interested in running would have to be a write-in candidate and will not be in the newsletter, e-blasts, on the ballots etc.

Traits of Good Board Members Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

RESPECT. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

GOOD LISTENING. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

THICK SKIN. Sometimes, residents—even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

EGOS ASIDE. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

AGENDA ASIDE. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise? **SKILL.** An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and team building backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills and temperaments. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job. Fellow board members and managers can help you with the transition and train you on board responsibilities, current work, projects and hot issues.

Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There's no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community.

CAL Puts the New in Happy New Year! by Sheryl Hutchings, Chair and Publicity Lead

s 2025 begins, CAL is focused on the "new" in Happy New Year. HEB residents will have a plethora of new things to look forward to in CAL's 2025 game plan, so pay attention!



Kickoff for our next term of classes in scheduled for January 7 at 10 in the morning, but it will take place in the rooms in the education wing of the Clubhouse, not the Antero Room as in the past. Look for specific information on the organization of Kickoff activities on our website at calheb.org.

The biggest new thing is the change to CAL's term structure. It is changing from a three quarters (Fall-Winter-Spring) term structure to a two semesters (Fall-Winter/Spring) term structure.

In 2025 CAL's winter & spring terms will be consolidated into a single term with a single registration period. Courses are scheduled in February, March and April and will be varied in length. Some will run for 4 weeks, some for 6, some for 8, and even one for 12. Start and end times will also be varied, so you might consider signing up for one class early in the semester and another class later in the semester.

The 2025 Fall Semester will run from September to November and will most likely also offer classes of varying lengths and start and end times.

Another new thing...Winter/Spring Semester classes won't be limited to just weekdays during the day only. Some are planned for evenings and on weekends, and at least one will offer a virtual attendance option to a limited number of registrants.

New class topics are on tap as well in response to community requests. Classes on "World War II in the Pacific" and "United States Military Nurses" are scheduled. A class on how to disconnect from cable tv, "Cutting the Cord", is scheduled for Thursday evenings, and a class on traditional Hawaiian culture will be meeting on Sunday afternoons. If you don't want to go out in bad winter weather, you can attend one class, "Conversations about the Court," via Zoom. Also new...for the first time ever CAL is offering one course that will meet for the full 12 weeks of the semester. It is called "Elderhood." The group will build a community of support while exploring ways to find purpose in peace in our unique stage of life. We fully understand that it's a long course, so it's no problem if you must miss a few classes.

The complete schedule of Winter/Spring Semester courses was posted on CAL's website, calheb.org, on December 20. Go to the website, look for the Winter/Spring Course Schedule tab in the menu bar to navigate to that page of the site, and check it out. CAL's website is relatively new, and we encourage all in the community to visit it often as we transition from eBlasts and emails and newsletter articles as publicity venues to a comprehensive communication hub available online all the time.



Other new things to report include changes to the CAL Lead Team at the end of the Winter/Spring semester. Sheryl Hutchings has served as Publicity Lead and CAL chair for six years and is term limited, so she will be leaving those positions. Alice Edwards's three-year term as Curriculum Lead will also be up at that time, so she will be leaving that position. Don't despair though...both Alice and Sheryl will continue to work as volunteers in important background roles.





beautification of our community, but also towards the elimination of one of the most irritating nuisances in our community.

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
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
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
