he operating results (subject to audit) for December 2024 are complete. The net result is an underrun of Net Income of \$65,090 versus a budgeted underrun of \$49,809. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year except for snow push expenses due to the 20 inches of snow we received over two days in March and November. We expect the November invoice to be paid for in the December results. However, we are underrunning communal water expense which will somewhat offset the higher snow push expense. For December 2024 reserve net income shows an overrun of \$4,459

vs budgeted overrun of \$8,808. We have had higher irrigation controllers spend and insurance reimbursements from the hail damages this summer. These expenses have been somewhat offset by higher returns on our investments.

SPRING PAINTING SCHEDULE

All the paint details are in, and the painters are excited to roll up their sleeves and tackle districts 20 & 22 this spring! If the weather plays nice, we're aiming to start in April. Let's get ready for some fresh coats of color!

TREE TRIMMING

Approximately 20 trees with branches touching Tradition structures are on the schedule to be trimmed late February/early March time frame.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM

During our January Quarterly meeting the Traditions Owners asked about the warranty period on our new irrigation controllers. We installed Opti Flow controllers by WeatherTrak. They are not valves, It is software that controls the valves. They have a warranty of 10 years, but we can expect more than that.

2025 ROOF REPLACEMENT SCHEDULE

Please note we will be reaching out via email to those Homeowners who will be getting new roofs and/or gutters this year once we have finalized the list with our contractor. As a reminder, original roofs are replaced at 20 years.

This line is updated so you can call it multiple times. Remember that snow pushing does not begin until the snow stops falling.

If you live in a Traditions home, your snow pushing is done by an outside group. Villages also has an outside group. Single-Family Contracted homes, as well as the streets, are handled by HEB. If you have questions regarding Traditions or Villages snow pushing and you have already called the Snow Line above, please do not call the Welcome Desk.

2025 HEBGC Master Board Election

Beginning with the 2012 HEBGC MBOD election, our association has used an electronic voting system provided by Vote-Now. Simply put, it reduces the expenses associated with preparing and mailing traditional paper ballots and streamlines the election process, including the vote count.

The official 2025 Election Day is Friday, April 18th.

All votes must be cast online or received as postal mail at Vote-Now's office by 12 Noon (Mountain Daylight time). There are two(2) – three(3) year term vacancies for the HEBGC Master Board.

An eligible voter must be a resident and on the Warranty Deed or part of a Family Trust etc. The voter's HOA account must be in good standing and must be current as of Friday, March 21, 2025. An account is considered in good standing when there are no past due HOA fees, special assessments, or fines imposed by the HOA.

Eligible voters who do not have internet access at their residence can vote using the Clubhouse computer, computers at a public library, ask a neighbor or call the Admin Office with your special code, and we can cast your vote for you. Voters who cannot or do not wish to use the electronic system can request a paper ballot mailed to their address on record.



Online voters receive an e-mail invitation in their designated e-mail account. If your email address has changed since January 2024, please contact the Admin Office at 720-235-1888 or email Jillian at JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com to update it right away. The invitation includes a link to www.vote-now.com's secure site with an embedded personal registration code. Once a ballot has been cast using this code, it cannot be re-used. When the link is clicked, the ballot automatically loads in a browser window. Clicking a candidate's name will show her/his biography. A verification screen shows the candidates chosen and an alert about any races in which no votes were cast. Voters can return to the ballot to make changes if necessary and submit their vote. A Vote-Now staff member acts as election administrator.

Paper ballots will be mailed by Vote-Now to voters who have not registered to vote electronically or those that don't have an email address on file with us. These voters will be required to send their ballots to Vote-Now via postal mail at their own expense. A message is included in the directions on the paper ballot specifying that if a ballot is cast electronically, the paper ballot will not be counted if it is mailed. When the paper ballots are received by Vote-Now, the election administrator will enter the voter's security code from the paper ballot and casts the vote by entering the code into the Vote-Now computer. The tallies are automatically made by the software, combining both paper and electronic votes. If the security code has already been used by the voter, the administrator will be notified and the voter will not be able to cast a vote a second time.

DID YOU KNOW?

As Spring approaches, here are several reminders!

We are seeing vehicles left on streets at night. Please remember that vehicles need to be in garages at night (or on driveways if you live in a single family home or Traditions).

If someone has passed or you have married or changed your name, please email JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com or drop off the documentation to the Clubhouse or Admin Building M-F 9 am - 4 pm, for our records.

We continue to have complaints regarding dog waste, dogs off leashes etc. Remember we are in the City of Aurora and follow their rules with regard to number of dogs, dog breeds, dogs off leashes, immediately picking up after your dog, etc.

Additionally, trash should be put out after 5 pm on Wednesday for pick-up on Thursday. Also, please do not leave your cans at the top of your driveway.

Also, only those with driver's licenses can drive a golf cart. Please do not let your grandchildren drive your cart. It is dangerous to them and to our Residents. We wouldn't want someone to get injured.

When it comes to RV's, they can only be parked in front of your home for 48 hours. At that time, they can be moved, with a permit from the Welcome Desk, to the Clubhouse Parking Lot for another 48 hours. At that time, they no longer can be stored in the Community.

Remember there is no parking in the drives of the Village units. These are Fire Lanes. All Village residents must keep their vehicles in their garages. Also, Visitor lots are for visitors and not resident overflow.

AAC Requests – Information to Provide for a Complete Application for Review:

If you are considering submitting for an exterior improvement, we have provided a sample below to adapt to any project you may be submitting for. Please email hebaac@heritageeaglebend.com for Plot Plans and AAC forms OR they can be found at www. heritageeaglebend.com website after logging in, select HOA select Committee Reports, select Architectural Submittals/AAC, select Architectural Submittal Form.

For a landscape request, you'll submit the following:

- AAC forms
 - ° including signatures from neighbors, at least 1-2 must sign (emails from neighbors acknowledging the project can be included with the forms and information)
 - ° initial all areas on the forms (no check marks)
 - ° include details of project
- Plot Plan
 - ° drawing on location of requested improvements
- Photo(s) of existing areas you wish to change
 - Additional information such as: Size, dimensions, accurate drawing of changes, plants, materials, etc.
- Any additional information helpful to the AAC in their review process

Lamp Posts, Lightbulbs, Mailbox Posts & Numbers, and Mailboxes

Thank you to those who have freshened up your lamp posts, mailbox posts, mailboxes, house numbers, and replaced light bulbs. These items make our community look great. In case you do not know the colors for these items, please see below:

Lamp Posts: The color for the lamp posts with the original builder installed fixtures is Rustoleum Rusty Metal Primer

Lightbulbs: The only bulb to be used is a maximum of 60 watt or equivalent size in soft white.

Mailbox Posts: The stain for the mailbox posts is a Sherwin Williams stain called "SW 3512 Cider Mill".

House Numbers for Mailboxes: Mailboxes must have the home address in 1½ to 2 inches high white reflective vinyl numbers attached to the front lid.



Mailboxes: Some residents have used Rustoleum Hunter Green to repaint. Or replacement mailboxes be purchased at Home Depot, Ace hardware, and Amazon as follows:

If you haven't heard, the Back to Golf Night is set for Wednesday, March 12 between 5:00 – 6:30 PM in the Antero Ballroom. The Tuesday Ladies 9/18 League Leadership team members will be there. Look for our table. We are excited to share our planned calendar of events for the year. We can also help you complete your registration and take payment for the league and 2025 GHIN fees. The fees remain at \$100; the league fee (\$50) and the GHIN fee (\$50).

Are you new to HEBGC or new to golf and looking to see which of our HEBGC leagues is right for you? Our Leadership team members will be on hand at the Back to Golf Night to help you. Can't make it to the Back to Golf Night? Email Pam Finch to get more information about the League.

What is the Tuesday Ladies 9/18 League? We are a sanctioned league within HEBGC, play on Tuesday mornings with a shot gun start for all 18-hole play. Nine-hole players follow behind the group with tee times. The League follows the USGA Rules of Golf, the HEBGC Local Rules and the League Rules. All players must establish a handicap with a handicap index range of 0-50.

Why the 9/18 designation? It's because each league member may choose, when they sign up for weekly play, whether to play 9 or 18 holes. After a full season of providing this selection to its members, the League has found that it was very popular. Being able to play 9 holes some weeks allowed those with busy schedules to still get in 9 holes. On those hot August days, instead of forgoing play because of the heat, players were able to get in a fast 9 holes before the heat peaked.

How it works? Members will decide if they want to play 9 or 18 holes each week when they sign up to play. Based on each player's selection, they will be paired with like players. Most play days will accommodate both 9 and 18 hole play. There are a few exceptions which are the Member/Guest and the Member/Member events. These will remain as 18 hole events. Each week there is an 18 hole game. Players may choose to play the game (\$3/fee) or not play the game. Nine-hole play does not play a game. However, the foursome may choose to play a game among themselves.

Flexible and Casual Monday Men's Golf by Larry Place

onday Men's Golf is an HEB tradition since the 2000s. Are you newly retired, a new resident, someone looking to meet new golfing friends, or someone looking to play a flexible, friendly and casual round of golf with your current buddies? This could be the group for you. This group can be a great way to meet new friends, neighbors, other golfers you do not normally play with, or form a foursome with your current golfing friends.

No need to play every week. No fees to be on the email list. You can pick whether you want to play in the early morning one week and in the late morning another week depending on your schedule. You can pick to play with some of your buddies or pick to meet new residents or a combination. You can sit down for a drink and/or a meal in the Eagle's Nest after your round. You only pay for applicable greens fees and cart fees on weeks when you decide to play.

All I need from you is your name, email address, preferred tees, and either your GHIN handicap or an average score and I will pair you up with players of similar ability who are playing on the same tees. If your ability goes up or down or you want to change tees during the season, let me know and I can change your preferences.

In 2025, the pro shop has scheduled us to play from March 17th through October 20th weather permitting. We average between 50 and 96 players per week depending on the time of year and the weather. Tee times vary from 7:30 through 10:57 depending on the time of year plus 4 noon shotgun starts scheduled due to course maintenance. I will send out an email to the email list 10 days prior to the date of play and after responses have been gathered, I will send out the tee sheet 5-6 days before the date of play. The player then just needs to show up, pay applicable cart and greens fees, play golf, and have fun.

There are currently over 210 members on the email list.

Eagle Bend Golf Association (EBGA)

Back to Golf Night is Wednesday March 12, 5 to 6:30

Get ready for the EBGA Sunday events. The first event is in May. The EBGA is open to all residents who are in good standing with the Master Association and maintain a current GHIN handicap index. Five fun events are played once a month on Sundays from May thru September. Events are structured with foursomes consisting of two couples per team and are followed by an optional meal where the scores and winners are announced. The pro shop establishes the pairings and flights for each event based on the player's GHIN handicap.

This is a great opportunity for HEB residents to participate in a fun series of couples golfing events and socialize with other players. The EBGA guidelines are as follows:

All players must have a current USGA Handicap Index. Each couple will consist of one male and one female golfer.
Golf handicaps are capped at 40.4 index.
Ladies play from the green tees.
Men can play the gold or white tees.

The annual **EBGA** dues are \$15/person - cash only please. You can sign up at Back to Golf Night, or pay at the first event you play in.

There is a \$7.00 per person event fee (cash only). \$5 is allocated for team prize money which is awarded as Pro Shop credits. \$2 is for cash payouts on closest to the pin and longest putt for the winning male and female player.
