## **President's Message** by Rex Gambrell, President of Master Board

he annual election for Master Board of Director positions was recently held earlier this month. There were 2 candidates running for 2 positions each for three year terms. Arleen Sandberg



is one of the two candidates that is a current board member. Arleen was re-elected for a second three-year term. The second candidate is Debbie Strine, who was elected to a three year term. Congratulations to you both and thank you for your willingness to serve on the Master Board. As you know Rick Matteson was term limited after the recent March board meeting. Rick served six years on the board as President for four years along with Treasurer this past year. Rick was an amazing board member and leader. He will be missed on the board.

Recently we signed a letter of Intent with Landscapes Unlimited to complete the Irrigation, Bunkers and Tee work. We will be working with our golf course architect, engineering firm and HOA attorney to get a contract prepared and signed in the upcoming weeks.

We have discussed with our contractor, Landscapes Unlimited, a tentative schedule for completing the work. Of course, the plan is tentative and can potentially change. As of now the plan is to get started on building the second pump house on hole 11 possibly later this year or early next year. The installation of main line irrigation pipe throughout the entire golf course will tentatively start in the spring or early summer next year. Those main irrigation lines will be installed on the outside of cart paths in native grass areas so golf play should not be interrupted for the most part. Lateral lines and sprinkler heads installation along with bunker work and new forward tees will start after Labor Day of 2026. The front nine holes and then the back nine holes separately will be shut down for this work to be completed. So, golf play will continue for nine holes at a time instead of shutting down the entire eighteen holes all at once. When work is completed for the first nine holes that side will re-open, and the second nine holes will be closed down and the same work completed. Once again, the tentative plan is to complete the entire project by the end of 2026 or early in 2027.

The operating results (subject to audit) for March 2025 are complete. The net result is an excess of \$21,515 versus a budgeted excess of \$27,462. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year and now that the snow season is behind us our financials are in good shape. For March 2025 reserve net income shows an excess of \$65,037 vs budgeted excess of \$76,992. Over the next few months, we will be monitoring the house painting and roof and gutter replacements to make sure they stay on budget.

## SUMMERTIME YARD MAINTENANCE AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

Summer is upon us, and here are several reminders!

Summer is here and we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – Waterwise landscaping is becoming more and more common. The city of Aurora is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB's Resident Improvement Guidelines for pre-approved designs and information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of the HEB RIGs can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/AAC.

**Statues & Yard Art** – Only one statue is permitted per front and back yard and cannot exceed 5 ft in height. All yard art requires prior approval from the AAC. Only 1 bird bath is permitted on any lot.

**Exterior Storage** – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, empty pots, ladders, gardening tools etc. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Mulch – Mulch breaks down over time and requires replenishment every 1-2 years. Make sure to take a look at your landscaping beds to see if they need a refresh of mulch.

Artificial Flowers - Artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

**Painting** – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Ring located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home's new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, ALL exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. #### Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

- 1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
- 2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
- 3. Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.
- No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed <u>only</u> in the Outdoor pool area.
- 5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
- 6. No smoking.
- 7. No pets allowed.
- 8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
- 9. No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
- 10. Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.

- 11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
- 12. Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
- 13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
- 14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
- 15. IMPORTANT: Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, <u>while it is happening</u>. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
- 16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.




## TWO-FOUR-SIX-EIGHT ---- WHO DOES CAL APPRECIATE?

Our May meeting at the Denver Public Library 5th floor got me thinking about libraries in general and what a great resource they are. Local, county, historical society and/or genealogy society libraries



are the first places I call when starting to research in a new county. They can be a great resource not only of local history, but also your family's history.

Some local libraries also have "vertical files" which are files of genealogy work donated from people in their community. Check out local libraries in your ancestor's area.

Don't forget about digital libraries such as Google Books (https://books. google.com/) or Internet Archive (https://archive.org/). They have local histories, biographies that might help with your search. Or, if you need to find a book, World Cat (https://search.worldcat.org/) can tell you what library(s) has the book both locally and nationwide.

Our local libraries give us access not only to books but also magazines through the Libby app. I found digital copies of genealogy magazines for loan such as the Family Tree Magazine - UK edition. The "how to" magazine for genealogists, the UK edition is filled with tips/information on specifically for the United Kingdom. Try it out!

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
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


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
