President's Message

The Master Board has received revised bids from the final three contractors for the golf course irrigation, bunkers and tees upcoming project in 2026. We are going through our final review of these bids and discussing with our golf course architect and irrigation engineering firm to determine the best contractor to complete the project in a timely and efficient manner. And of course, we will also be looking to get the best and most qualified contractor keeping price in mind. Our goal is to get this work under contract in the next month or so.



On another note I want to address questions that sometimes arise concerning minutes taken at our monthly board meetings. Typically meeting minutes are supposed to be records of official actions taken at these meetings. Colorado law requires that homeowner associations keep minutes of all meetings of its members and its board of directors. However, as the name implies, "minute" means small and "minutes" should be brief. Minutes are not intended to be transcriptions of all discussions that ensued during the meeting, nor are they supposed to be a record of complaints or disagreements among attendees.

Below is a list of suggestions from our legal firm Altitude Law that we follow in recording or writing minutes based on Colorado law:

- *Summarize, don't transcribe*
- *Follow the agenda*
- *Include the basics*
(name, date, time, place, persons present, purpose)
- *Report the motion and vote*
(who motioned, who seconded, and the vote result)
- *Attach committee, officer, and other reports provided during the meeting if any*
- *Record action items*

In reviewing our meeting minutes when they are consistently more than two pages in length, we reevaluate our minute-taking process since we are probably adding too much information.

At our April Board meeting we will elect officers for the next 12 months. I am very grateful that Arleen Sandberg has decided to return for another term on the Board and that Debbie Strine has volunteered to join the Board. I look forward to serving alongside both of them along with my other Board colleagues for the next year.

If you are considering submitting for an exterior improvement, we have provided a sample below to adapt to any project you may be submitting for. Please email hebaac@heritageeaglebend.com for Plot Plans and AAC forms OR they can be found at www.heritageeaglebend.com website after logging in, select HOA select Committee Reports, select Architectural Submittals/AAC, select Architectural Submittal Form.

For a landscape request, you'll submit the following:

- AAC forms
 - including signatures from neighbors, at least 1-2 must sign (emails from neighbors acknowledging the project can be included with the forms and information)
 - initial all areas on the forms (no check marks)
 - include details of project
- Plot Plan
 - drawing on location of requested improvements
- Photo(s) of existing areas you wish to change
 - Additional information such as: Size, dimensions, accurate drawing of changes, plants, materials, etc.
- Any additional information helpful to the AAC in their review process

TRADITIONS TALKING BY TRADITIONS EAGLE BEND BOARD MEMBERS

The operating results (subject to audit) for February 2025 are complete. The net result is an overrun of Net Income of \$18,190 versus a budgeted overrun of \$19,644. The reserve results for February are complete as well and the net result is an overrun of \$46,453 versus a budgeted overrun of \$51,328. This early in the year we do not anticipate any major differences to the budget. These overruns will continue for the next few months as we wait for the higher spend months in the summer.

NEIGHBORHOOD PAINTING UPDATE – STARTING APRIL 28TH!

Exciting news! Homes in Districts 20 & 22 are getting a fresh coat of paint, with crews starting on April 28th. The project is expected to take 3 to 4 weeks to complete.

If your home is in these districts, please move furniture away from walls and take down any hanging decorations before your scheduled painting. Door notifications will be posted 48 hours in advance, so you'll know when the crew is coming.

Thank you for your cooperation as we refresh the neighborhood!

IRRIGATION

The communal irrigation system and the 92 individual home systems are scheduled to start running sometime after May 1st. The timing will depend on the amount of rain we receive throughout April and May.

The Water Department has again raised the cost of water for the communal system by 8.3% this year. The residential rates for Tier 1 and 2 remained the same, but there are increases for uses for (Tier 3) 10, to 20 Kgal of 8.2% and (Tier 4) 20+ Kgal 3.6%. The Water Department has a new online app called Eyeonwater.com where each homeowner can monitor the running times for their system.

Upgraded controllers on the communal system were installed last year, which will help ensure efficiency in the operation of the system.

It is imperative that we stay within compliance, save water to control our budget to maintain a beautiful community.

EYEONWATER SAVED ONE HOMEOWNER

Recently one Traditions homeowner suffered a hot water heater failure. The failed unit was in the basement and not routinely examined by the owner. Water started pouring out of the tank, filled the drip pan, and discharged into the nearby floor drain. Fortunately, this homeowner had the Aurora Water Department application EyeOnWater installed on his phone. The application sent an alarm to his phone reporting that a leak was in progress. This alarm allowed the homeowner to search for the leak, find the situation with the hot water heater, and shut off the incoming water. No major water damage to the home occurred thanks to EyeOnWater. Its free to use, easy to understand, and informative.

- Homeowners, please make sure that before renting out your home you received prior approval from the HOA. If you sell, you cannot not sell the ability to rent. This restriction is part of our governing documents.
- If you have a dog, you MUST pick up the poop while walking them! It is the law!
- What happens when you call the HOA Hotline:
 - General Guidelines (although it may work differently for each call): The hot line number is checked twice a day, not at the same time, and any calls are sent via email to the entire Board and the administration staff.
 - I know some folks say no one calls you back. This Board wants to make sure we do the best we can, but sometimes we might have to respond by coming to your door and then the day gets away from us - so call back after 4 days if you haven't heard from anyone.
 - Please remember we are a volunteer Board, and we have doctor appointments, tests, and family etc., just like you. We will respond as quickly as we can. We have someone responsible for landscaping, someone for VIVA, someone for irrigation, someone for concrete, someone for roofs, someone for painting, someone for gutters, someone for snow, someone for insurance and someone for budget questions and if there is a question that does not fall into a specific area then usually the President of the Board will call and try and address the issue.
 - For landscaping, VIVA, irrigation and concrete the Board member will want to come see it first before deciding on action and this could take a day or two.
 - For roofs and gutters, we will forward your calls directly to our provider, and they will call you and let you know when they are coming out. They will then let our Board member know what needs to be done and give us a quote. We have a budget, so the Board member will approve it based on the budget. Then the provider will come and do the work letting you know directly. You might not hear from the Board member at all.
 - Painting is scheduled every 9 years, so advance notice is always given and any issues received are given directly to the provider to fix while they are on property.

TIME FOR SPRING CLEANING AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

*As Spring approaches,
here are several reminders!*

Spring is upon us, I know we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – Waterwise landscaping is becoming more and more common. The city of Aurora is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB's Resident Improvement Guidelines for pre-approved designs and information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of the HEB RIGs can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/AAC.

Statues & Yard Art – Only one statue is permitted per front and back yard and cannot exceed 5 ft in height. All yard art requires prior approval from the AAC. Only 1 bird bath is permitted on any lot.

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, empty pots, ladders, gardening tools etc. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Mulch – Mulch breaks down over time and requires replenishment every 1-2 years. Make sure to take a look at your landscaping beds to see if they need a refresh of mulch.

Artificial Flowers – Artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Painting – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Ring located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home's new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, **ALL** exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. POOL OPENING! MAY 23RD

We are looking forward to the outdoor pool opening later in May! Here are some reminders for the upcoming pool season that you need to be aware of ...

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
3. **Guests must be accompanied by a Resident. Residents are responsible for their Guests at all times.**
4. No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed only in the Outdoor pool area.
5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
6. No smoking.
7. No pets allowed.
8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
9. No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
10. Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.
11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
12. Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
15. **IMPORTANT:** Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, while it is happening. A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
16. Management reserves the right to deny use to anyone at any time.
