President's Message by Rex Gambrell, President of Master Board

he Golden Eagle Men's Member Guest Tournament was a huge success. The golf course was in excellent shape, the food throughout the three tournament days was also great! I



played in the tournament like I have many years before, so I was able to experience it again first-hand. As usual Jason, Marty, John, Darren and their teams all did a fantastic job in making the tournament first class. Next on the schedule for August 14th and 15th is the lady's Diamond Eagle member guest tournament. I have no doubt that the entire experience for the ladies will be first class and just as good as the men's Golden Eagle Member Guest tournament.

As far as an update goes for the golf course project there is not really anything new to report. Like I have said in prior meetings and in newsletters a portion of this work is scheduled to begin this summer or fall including the construction of the pump house on hole 11 and the installation of main line irrigation pipe.

We have already started to receive materials for this project including sprinkler heads and associated electronics. And in the next few months you will also see main line irrigation pipe delivered to various areas throughout the community.

In the fall of next year nine holes at a time will be scheduled to be closed so that lateral lines, sprinkler heads, bunker work & new forward tees can be installed. As of now the completion of all work is still projected to be the end of next year or early 2027.

Management upon commencement of the irrigation, bunkers and tees project will be updating everyone throughout the community of ongoing progress and work that is completed and what to expect next from our contractor, Landscapes Unlimited. The plan will be to update all HEB homeowners and residents on a regular basis by eblasts, continued articles in the monthly newsletters and of course in board meetings until the project has been completed.

Okay on another topic, the master board appreciates all of you that have volunteered your time and input serving on a committee. However, as always, we are looking for new volunteers since we have many committee members that have served for several years and I'm sure would like a break and a chance to step down. Just like board members there are supposed to be term limits for committee members. In theory committee members are only supposed to serve two terms. Although in many cases there are some volunteers that have served more than two terms in order to ensure a full committee. So please consider signing up for a committee.

TRADITIONS TALKING BY TRADITIONS EAGLE BEND BOARD MEMBERS

The operating results (subject to audit) for June 2025 are complete. The year-to-date net result is an excess of \$19,689 versus a budgeted excess of \$2,893. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year and we feel confident that our operational financials are in good shape. For June 2025 year-to-date reserve net income shows a shortfall of \$215,263 vs budgeted shortfall of \$380,466. Over the last few months, we have paid most of our invoices for both house painting and roof/gutter replacements. We will be on budget for house painting but over budget for roofs/ gutters for the full year. We have replaced more roofs than originally expected and will be overrunning that reserve expense for the year.

ELECTION FOR TRADITIONS BOARD

Please take a moment to review the candidate biographies in this month's issue of the HEB Newsletter—a publication we all enjoy. Several current board members are seeking re-election for another term. We encourage you to thoughtfully consider this slate of candidates and cast your votes for this important responsibility.

Many residents appreciate the work of the Traditions Board, but it's worth noting that without these dedicated volunteers, the HOA would need to hire an outside management company to oversee key services such as irrigation, landscaping, painting, roofing, gutters, snow removal, and general community oversight. Bringing in outside management would likely increase monthly fees and could reduce the level of personal care we receive as neighbors within the Traditions community.



DRY AND DEAD LAWNS

At the July 14, 2025 Quarterly Meeting, the topic of dry and dead lawns was discussed in detail with representatives from the HOA's irrigation contractors - ET Irrigation and SaBells. They identified four primary causes:

- 1. Winter drought
- 2. Intense sun exposure on south-facing lots
- 3. Isolated incidents of accidental lawn chemical spills
- 4. Damage from animals (dog urine, bunny grazing, rodent burrows)

Our experts recommend the following homeowner actions:

- If you are on an independently metered irrigation system, test your system to ensure all sprinkler heads are covering lawn areas properly. Report any broken systems to the Traditions Hotline.
- Consider hand watering problem spots to encourage dormant roots to recover and restart growth.
- Report any dead grass areas through the Traditions Hotline so they can be considered for a potential fall remediation program.

This is a point of concern for the Board as there may be other residents who have also been misinformed. To clarify for everyone, there is no common ground in the Villages. We all own property. Individual property lines can be viewed online. Roofs, painting, gutter repairs and concrete are the Board's responsibility, and repairs are handled from HOA dues. Irrigation, mowing and bush trimming are also handled by the Board. However, each homeowner does have some responsibility for their individual property.

Last year a "Responsibility Document" was mailed to existing homeowners or it was provided for new owners when they registered at the Administration Building. Please review this document to determine your property responsibilities. In addition, if you want to remove a bush, plant a bush, plant a tree, or xeriscape these are decisions you can make with the approval of the Architectural Committee. *Please make sure when selling your property your real estate agent correctly represents the Villages*.

We are excited and pleased that 5 individuals have volunteered to serve on the Village Board. We want to get the board back to a board of 7 individuals, so we will elect 4 individuals in the October elections. Feel free to call any of the candidates and talk to them prior to the elections.

FALL CLEAN UP!

As Fall approaches, here are some reminders!

all is upon us, and with the colder weather approaching, we know people are beginning to think about prepping their homes for the upcoming seasons. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the colder weather and keeping the exterior of your home neat and well maintained:

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, ladders, gardening tools etc. Empty pots must be rid of dead plants, as well stored out of site. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Leaf Clean-Up – Make sure to take a look at your yards once the trees shed their leaves, and be sure to rake and bag any fallen leaves. Please do not blow them into the streets.

Artificial Flowers – As much as we may start to miss our summer flowers, artificial flowers are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Tree Trimming Reminder – If your trees in your Tree Lawn (area between sidewalk and street) have over-hanging branches on the sidewalks or streets, please be certain to have them trimmed at your earliest convenience. Please note per City of Aurora, trees must be trimmed to a minimum height of 8 feet above sidewalks, and a minimum of 13.5 feet above streets.



As a reminder, <u>ALL</u> exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. No Overnight Street Parking

Overnight parking on streets is not allowed anywhere in Heritage Eagle Bend. The only exception is a 48-hour period for RV or moving truck loading/unloading. Moving a vehicle temporarily and returning it to the street may be viewed as an attempt to bypass the rules.

🗑 8-Hour Parking Limit

A vehicle may not be parked for more than 8 hours in any 7-day period on streets, frontage roads, or common driveways.

1 Guest Parking Is for Guests ■

Guest parking areas are located throughout the community and are intended for short-term guest use only. They are not to be used by residents for long-term parking or as a way to avoid using their driveway.

And Driveway Parking Rules

- Permitted: Single Family Homes and Traditions Homes
- Prohibited: The Villages even if it seems you're not blocking anyone, driveway parking is not allowed in the shared driveways.

Temporary Overflow Parking

Short-term parking is available at the Clubhouse for residents with special circumstances. A Permit is required and is available from the Welcome Desk or Administrative Office.

They broadcast the Magic Flute opera live into movie theaters around the United States and a couple of theaters in Britain, Norway and Japan. Since that time the live HD broadcasts now are in more than 60 countries around the world and in every continent except Antarctica. The world of opera has changed dramatically over the past several years. Interesting to note that when the Met HD performance of Aida was shown in a huge theater in Mexico City 6,000 people attended and when The Barber of Saville in HD was broadcast it was watched by 60,000 viewers around the world.

Highly trained singers now are from all over the world. At the Met opera house a singer must be able to project around 100 feet to reach the back wall of the highest balcony and that is without a microphone.

The nearest participating theater to Heritage Eagle Bend is the AMC Highlands near C470 and Broadway. Tickets are around \$22 dollars dependent on purchasing at the ticket office or ordering online.
