President's Message by Rex Gambrell, President of Master Board

A ll of us owe Arleen Sandberg a big thank-you for an outstanding job as the Secretary and Board member. At the October 1st Board Meeting Bob Foglia was appointed by

the board to serve the remainder of Arleen's term up to the April 2026 election. Bob will then have to run for election at that time.

Recently the Board held a 2026 proposed Budget Presentation meeting. A few days later the Board conducted a Resident Town Hall Budget Presentation meeting. The proposed 2026 Budget was presented to all in attendance.

The 2026 Budget Ballots were emailed to homeowners via their District Delegates and should be returned to Delegates on or before Thursday, October 30th. The delegate budget vote count meeting will then be held on Tuesday November 4th at 5:30 PM. Assuming residents ratify the proposed budget the monthly HOA dues next year will increase by \$25 a month to a total of \$373 per month.

Thank you in advance for supporting the Board of Directors' recommendation to approve the budget, and to put into the Working Capital Fund any positive net operating income that we have at the end of this year.

The design for the pump house on hole 11 has been approved and is now at the City of Aurora for approval and to obtain a building permit. Our contractor Landscapes Unlimited is also currently working with Xcel and electricians to bring electrical power to the pump house. There is electrical power near where the pump house will be built so all that needs to be done is to determine if there is adequate power or if additional power needs to be brought to that location. If that is the case upgrading the power will take place after the permit from the City of Aurora is issued and construction begins on the pump house.

We are also planning on removing the sand trap next to the practice chipping green over to the driving range area. This way we will prevent errant golf balls from being hit into the pickleball courts. By moving the practice sand trap next to the practice chipping green over to the driving range, golfers will have the opportunity to practice both short and long sand shots.

Soon main line irrigation pipe will be delivered to various areas throughout the community in anticipation of starting the installation of that pipe in spring of next year.

In order to keep everyone throughout the community informed of the progress of work that is completed and what to expect next from our contractor Landscapes Unlimited the plan is to update HEB owners and residents throughout the entire project by eblasts, course in board meetings.

TRADITIONS TALKING BY TRADITIONS EAGLE BEND BOARD MEMBERS

The operating results (subject to audit) for August 2025 are complete. The year-to-date net result is a shortfall of \$12,575 versus a budgeted shortfall of \$28,292. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year and we feel confident that our operational financials are in good shape. For August 2025 year-to-date reserve net income shows a shortfall of \$407,214 vs budgeted shortfall of \$356,138. Over the last few months, we have paid most of our invoices for both house painting and roof/gutter replacements. We will be on budget for house painting but over budget for roofs/gutters for the full year. We have replaced more roofs than originally expected and will be overrunning that reserve expense for the year.

The fall cleanup consisting of the 2nd shrub pruning, fall cleanup, aeration and winterization has been completed. Be sure to monitor your yards during the dry fall and winter months for irrigation requirements.

Be sure to call the Hotline before December if you have any branched touching your structure.

As winter draws closer, homeowners are reminded to protect young trees (three to five years old) thin, barked or newly planted trees from harsh winter conditions. The wrapping process involves applying a material such as brown craft paper, polypropylene fabric or plastic tree guards to keep deer teeth off the tender trunks around the trunk of the tree to prevent damage.

SNOW SEASON

We could all use a refresher on what to be aware of when it snows here at HEB. The Snow Line is 303-343-3063 to find out if there will be a snow push. Traditions clears the driveways of Traditions homes, the sidewalks leading up to the porches, as well as porches if the snow depth averages. 3 inches or more across the community. The snow push will not start until it is stop snowing.

7th cold weather advancing, this is a good time to remind everyone once again of snow policies. Snow will be pushed at 2" AFTER the snow stops.

Remember:

- IF you put down any type of ice melt, we ask that you do NOT use a salt-based product as it eats the concrete.
- During storms and dark winter, we ask you to leave your FRONT PORCH light on as this helps snow removal crews
- SNOWLINE number is 303.343.3063; this number will be updated during snowstorms for crew progress.
- Call the HOTLINE if you have issues.

We also want to take this opportunity to remind you of some of the general LEASING regulations for residences in the Villages:

• Owners desiring to lease their lots may do so only if they have applied for and received from the Association either a "Leasing Permit" or a "Hardship Permit."

- An Owner's request for a Leasing Permit shall be approved if current, outstanding Leasing Permits have not been issued for more than 10% of the total lots in the community (there are currently 241 Lots).
- No Short-Term Leases are permitted. "Short-term" means for a period of less than 12 months. This includes any Lease, rental or other occupancy through use of Airbnb, HomeAway, VRBO, or other online rental sites.
- Leasing permits shall be valid only as to specific Owners and Lots and shall not be transferable between either Lots or Owners.
- Leasers should NOT CALL THE HOTLINE with problems. They need to call the Owners. Only Owners should call the Hotline!
- More detailed information is available in Section 7.4 of the Amended and Restated Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions of Village Eagle Bend.





You might ask what is the Heritage Eagle Bend Founders Club by Lou Polakowski

Then Eagle Bend was just a prairie with shrubs and yucca plants, some brave pioneers chose to take a chance on a new concept in the Denver area. US Homes had a dream to build a community for active adults. We attended many informational socials, to hear about the project. They (US Homes) met with us and asked what kind of homes we would be interested in having. From our perspective they drew up house plans, we had no models to look at and choose from.

This area, Eagle Bend was given this name because of the eagles that were living in the trees between the 17th & 18th holes on the golf course. They started by building the golf course a few years before they even started building our homes. After the golf course was laid out they started charting out our lots. That is when they had the lottery and we were able to pick our lots and the house plan that we wanted to purchase.

Those of us who were interested in this concept paid a \$1000 deposit so that we could be in the first phase of this development. The lottery started with number 300 and worked down to number 1. This was the number of lots available in the first phase. There was a packed house at the hotel conference room. The names were randomly pulled and we could see where we were on the list.

As the project developed, those of us fortunate enough to have one of the first 300 numbers were called to stop into the temporary module on Smoky Hill Road that is now The Rock Restaurant and they gave us binoculars to see our area. Depending on the type of home we wanted, we had a choice of lots in certain areas.

Access to the site was difficult, since Gartrell Road didn't exist and there was no access to E-470. It took many months for the project to be built. We watched the progress of the golf course and the infrastructure before the homes were actually started.

US Homes started the Founders Club made up of the lucky first 100 draws. There is a plaque on the wall in the clubhouse library of the opening of our clubhouse which didn't open until at least a year after the first residents moved into their homes. The bricks around the fire pit outside by the swimming pool include the names of the Founders.

Our numbers have changed dramatically in the past 25 years, we now have only 26 residences from our first original 100 homes.

This was the beginning of HEB and the wonderful community in which we live.
