President's Message

Residents approved the 2026 budget on November 4, with 1,244 voting yes and 181 voting opposed (17 abstained). Thank you to everyone who took the time to vote. Also thank you to those who made this annual process work smoothly including members of the Legal &



Compliance Committee for conducting the vote and ensuring its accuracy. Additionally thank you to all delegates for their efforts in getting the voting ballots out to their districts and then gathering those ballots and casting the votes at the ratification meeting.

The vote outcome means that 2026 HOA dues will increase by \$25 a month to \$373 per month.

You also voted to place into the Working Capital Fund any positive net operating income (NOI) that we have at the end of 2025. The vote totals: 1,253 votes to put the money into the Reserve Fund, and 179 votes to refund the money to homeowners (10 abstained). If the year ends with a positive NOI, the funds will be transferred after the 2025 audit is completed sometime in mid-2026.

On behalf of my Board colleagues and General Manager Gene Blum, thank you for your continued willingness to provide financial support for our community.

Thank you in advance to the volunteers who are turning the Clubhouse into a holiday spectacle. HEB's holiday lighting will be turned on Thanksgiving night and we are looking forward to the decorations that many of you also will light up.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for September 2025 are complete. The year-to-date net result is an excess of \$908 versus a budgeted shortfall of \$22,885. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year and we feel confident that our operational financials are

in good shape. For September 2025 year-to-date reserve net income shows a shortfall of \$385,703 vs budgeted shortfall of \$334,474. Over the last few months, we have paid most of our invoices for both house painting and roof/gutter replacements. We will be on budget for house painting but over budget for roofs/gutters for the full year. We have replaced more roofs than originally expected and will be overrunning that reserve expense for the year.

SNOW

When it snows here at HEB call the Snow Line Number line 303-343-3063 to find out if there will be a snow push. Traditions clears the driveways of Traditions homes, the sidewalks leading up to the porches, as well as porches if the snow depth averages 3 inches or more across the community. The snow push will not start until it stops snowing.

FRESH PAINT COMING TO DISTRICT 23 NEXT SPRING!

Exciting news! TEB Homes in District 23 are scheduled for a fresh coat of exterior paint in Spring 2026. This includes homes on E. Heritage Pkwy, S. Tempe Ct, and S. Sicily Ct. If you love your current colors, sit back and relax—no action is needed! Your home will be painted in the same colors.

Thinking about a new look? Check out the approved colors in the admin office. In order to change your base or trim colors, both you and your roof mate must submit an AAC form to the admin office by December 19th.

- Snow Guideline:
 - » Snow will be pushed at 2" after the snow has stopped
 - » Please keep your porchlight on during bad weather
 - » Notify the Hotline of ANY damage within 48 hours of the push
 - » Notify the Hotline of any water runoff issues pushing rocks into drains, walks, or driveways or down tree limbs
 - » Please do not use any salt-based ice melt

HEB Master Association (all residences) \$373.00 monthly Village Sub-Association (townhomes) \$315.00 monthly

Traditions Sub-Association (duplexes) \$237.00 or \$194.00 monthly*

*Homes located on E. Kettle Place, S. Buchanan Way, and E. Mineral Place pay individually for their exterior irrigation water, resulting in a \$194/month rate. The remaining Traditions homes pay \$237/month, which includes exterior irrigation water.

2026 Master Board of Directors Election – Looking for Candidates!

Interested Candidates: The 2026 election for three (3) seats will take place in April. Two terms will be for three (3) years and one term will be for two (2) years. A prospective candidate must own a home in Heritage Eagle Bend Golf Community (and be on the deed) and their HOA account must be/remain current.

Candidates may begin submitting their applications, a brief biography (not to exceed 250 words) and a color picture.

Deadline for submitting applications will be February 20th, 2026.

Any application received after February 20th, 2026 will not be accepted.

After this date, anyone interested in running would have to be a write-in candidate and will not be in the newsletter, e-blasts, on the ballots etc.

Traits of Good Board Members

Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

RESPECT. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

GOOD LISTENING. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

THICK SKIN. Sometimes, residents—even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

EGOS ASIDE. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

AGENDA ASIDE. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise?

SKILL. An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and team building backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills and temperaments. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job. Fellow board members and managers can help you with the transition and train you on board responsibilities, current work, projects and hot issues.

Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There's no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community.

LAMPLIGHTERS

WHO AND WHAT:

The Lamplighters are resident volunteers who change exterior lights for residents who are unable to change their own. Specifically, the Lamplighters will change:



- Lamp post and garage lights for Traditions and Village residents.
- 2. Only lamp post lights for residents in single family homes.

HELP WANTED:

We have lost several long-time, dedicated volunteers and need volunteers to replace them. If you are willing to serve the community in this way, please contact Jerry Gossner at (303) 680-5946. We will provide the training and the tools, and the HOA will supply the bulbs. This will involve only a couple of hours a month.

Contact the Welcome Desk at 303-693-7788 to request bulb replacement.

Please check that the GFI circuit (normally on an electrical outlet just inside the garage door) has not been tripped before you call about a post light. On most HEB homes, the GFI circuit provides power to the post light and can only be reset at night when the garage lights are on.

DO YOU WANT TO SAVE SOME MONEY???

If your garage and lamp post lights come on before all your neighbors' lights and stay on after all your neighbors' lights are off, your photo sensor probably needs to be replaced. Similarly, if none of your lights work after checking the bulbs and circuit breakers, your photo sensor probably needs to be replaced. These are available at the local hardware stores for about \$14. If you need assistance replacing a photo sensor, help is available by calling Jerry Gossner at (303) 680-5946.

WET WEATHER WOES

Our post lights weren't designed for wet, windy weather. Water gets inside and either causes the bulb to fail or trips the GFI circuit in the garage. If you have replaced the bulb in the lamp post and it still doesn't work, it's likely the GFI circuit needs to be reset. In some cases, water may have rusted the bulb socket itself to the point that it needs to be replaced. This will probably require an electrician.

MARINE CORPS RESERVE



This holiday season, HEBGC will be partnering with our Hilltop at Inspiration neighbors to collect gifts for the Marine Toys for Tots program. Established in 1947, last year they distributed over 186 thousand toys to more than 91 thousand children in the greater Denver area. We organized a group in our neighborhood and so far, we cooked dinner twice. We call ourselves "Grateful Givers of HEB." We found it to be a rewarding way to give back to those in need. We get to eat and share conversation with these families.

Your group handles the shopping and paying for the food. All cooking must be done in their well stocked, large kitchen and includes clean up. So far, we have served 20 -30 family members at each visit.

Their Aurora facility is on Potomac just a few blocks south of the Anshutz Medical campus and can house up to 45 families.
