appy New Year. I hope the holidays were enjoyable for everyone.

I would like to thank the entire Heritage Eagle Bend staff for a successful 2025. Financially HEB exceeded its NOI (Net Operating Income) budget. So those funds will be placed into the Working Capital Fund



after the 2025 audit is completed sometime in mid-2026.

Now that 2026 is here staff is gearing up alongside of our landscape contractor to get the golf course irrigation, bunkers and tees project started and then subsequently completed by year end assuming the weather cooperates. Work has already started on this project. Irrigation pipe has been delivered throughout several areas on the golf course. Additionally, irrigation heads and associated electronics have also been delivered to HEB. As you know over the past couple of years this project has been discussed in almost every board meeting, in newsletter articles and in the minutes of those past Board meetings. This past December the landscape contractor's crews started fusing main line irrigation pipes on holes #10 and #11. After fusing they began installing those pipes in trenches dug in the native areas. Of course, all of the work so far has been weather permitting. And will continue to be weather permitting throughout the upcoming winter months in 2026.

All in all, this year looks to be an exciting but challenging year with such a major and massive project getting under way.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for October $^{\text{Total Expenses}}$ 2025 are complete. The year-to-date net result is an underrun of \$5,366 versus a budgeted Net Income shortfall of \$26,978. There have been no major Checking Account - US unanticipated expenses so far this year and we feel working Capital Bank B confident that our operational financials are in good shape. net income shows a shortfall of \$368,269 vs budgeted shortfall of \$308,810. Over the last few months, we have paid most of our invoices for both house painting and roof/gutter replacements. We will be on budget for house painting but over budget for roofs/ gutters for the full year. We have replaced more roofs than originally expected and will be overrunning that reserve expense for the year.

PROCESS OF SNOW

We measure in north facing driveways at 3 to 6 locations including the clubhouse parking lot, Heritage Parkway, and at the bottom of East Canyon Place. We average all of the measurements to see if we meet the 3-inch minimum. Depending on the snow depth there will be 8 to 10 shovelers for each of the 3 crews. Call the snow line at 303-343-3063 to learn about plans to push.

remember to NOT put your trash cans near the snow stakes where they can be easily broken when the trash is collected. Also, please do not use any salt-based ice melt. Notify the Hotline of ANY damage within 48 hours of the push or of any water runoff issues pushing rocks into drains, walks, or driveways or down tree limbs due to snow.



*Homes located on E. Kettle Place, S. Buchanan Way, and E. Mineral Place pay individually for their exterior irrigation water, resulting in a \$194/month rate. The remaining Traditions homes pay \$237/month, which includes exterior irrigation water.

Traits of Good Board Members

Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do.

If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

RESPECT. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive and on point. We're looking for people who can lead by consensus, not by command.

GOOD LISTENING. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

THICK SKIN. Sometimes, residents—even other board members—can be mean and insulting. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

EGOS ASIDE. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

AGENDA ASIDE. Members who come to the board looking to help only themselves are a problem. A board is more productive when members don't have a personal punch list. Are you able to look after the community, not just your own interests? Are you willing to compromise?

SKILL. An association is a business. So having board members with accounting, organizational behavior and team building backgrounds can help. Someone with a financial background, for example, might make for a good treasurer.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills and temperaments. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job. Fellow board members and managers can help you with the transition and train you on board responsibilities, current work, projects and hot issues.

Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There's no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community.

This line is updated so you can call it multiple times. Remember that snow pushing does not begin until the snow stops falling before we come and push it.

If you live in a Traditions home, your snow pushing is done by an outside group. Villages also has an outside group. Single-Family Contracted homes, as well as the streets, are handled by HEB. If you have questions regarding Traditions or Villages snow pushing and you have already called the Snow Line above, please do not call the Welcome Desk. Instead, you'll leave a message on the:

REMINDERS TO HOMEOWNERS REGARDING DRIVEWAY RAMPS & SAFETY CONES

From the RIGs:

2.26a **Driveway Ramps.** Notification is required. It is allowed, with notification to Management, to install a driveway ramp. Any ramp must be professionally manufactured, not assembled lumber or planks.

As these ramps can interfere with curb-to-curb street snow pushing, it is preferred that they are removed by November 1st and not re-installed until May 1st. If an owner prefers to leave a ramp in place during snow pushing season, safety cones should be placed on each end when snow is present or expected and removed during clear weather. The property owner is responsible for any damage that occurs due to ramp.

We are noticing that safety cones are being left out even when the weather is nice, and snow is not expected. Please make sure to bring these cones in when the weather is nice.

If you are, out of town for the majority of winter, we ask that you please bring in the ramps for the winter before you leave. Your cooperation and understanding are much appreciated and helps keep our community looking beautiful and less like a construction zone.

Preventing Elder Abuse by Bill Weinstein MD

n elder abuse definition has been adopted by the World Health Organization as "a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust, which causes harm or distress to an older person."

The elderly are among society's most vulnerable people and national statistics reveal elder abuse is present in around 10% in the over-65 population. Older Americans now comprise the fastest growing segment of our population. They may have medical and functional impairments that put them at higher risk of being abused.

Elder abuse is a combination of some of the toughest elements of child abuse and domestic violence. This may include:

- Physical abuse when someone causes bodily harm by pushing, hitting or slapping.
- Emotional abuse, sometimes called psychological abuse, can include a caregiver saying hurtful words, yelling, threatening, or repeatedly ignoring the older person. Keeping that person from seeing close friends and relatives is another form of emotional abuse.
- Neglect occurs when the caregiver does not try to respond to the older person's needs.
- Abandonment is leaving a senior alone without planning for his or her care.
- Sexual abuse involves a caregiver forcing an older adult to watch or be part of sexual acts.
- Financial exploitation happens when money or belongings are stolen.
 - Healthcare fraud can be committed by family, friends, doctors, hospital staff, and other healthcare workers.

98% of physicians feel that they have not been educated enough about elder abuse and are frequently unable to identify it. 75% say that they couldn't put in a report unless they had conclusive evidence of elder abuse. Most reports are submitted by social workers since physicians wait until there is something conclusive.

There is a whole list of red flags, from subtle signs of neglect, soiled clothing and poor nail care, to bruising patterns that could signify physical abuse. Elders may not feel safe, someone may be hurting them, nobody prepares their meals or meets their needs, or someone has taken things that belong to them.

Most physical wounds heal in time. But, any type of mistreatment can leave the abused person feeling fearful and depressed. Sometimes, the victim thinks the abuse is his or her fault. Protective services agencies can suggest support groups and counseling that can help the abused person heal the emotional wounds.

We should make a report and let law enforcement and Adult Protective Services (APS) determine if there is mistreatment going on. We all face the challenge of ageism where we ignore those elderly residents who we fail to see as regularly as before. We assume that they have moved, passed away or simple do not want to participate in community activities. This lack of curiosity for the well being of our neighbors is pervasive and is a reason why we don't do a better job of identifying elder abuse. Elder abuse will not stop on its own. Someone else needs to step in and help.
