

March brings a little luck, a little sunshine, and in Colorado... at least one more snowstorm just to keep us guessing. Even so, we're lucky to call the HEB community home and even luckier to be part of the warm, welcoming Traditions neighborhood. Wishing everyone a happy, healthy, and 'may-the-roads-be-clear' kind of March.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for December 2025 are complete. The year-to-date net result is an overrun of \$2,124 versus a budgeted overrun of \$2,517. There have been no major unanticipated expenses so far this year and we remain on budget. For December 2025 year-to-date reserve net income shows a shortfall of \$282,301 vs budgeted shortfall of \$254,482. We will be on budget for house painting, but over budget for roofs/gutters for the full year. We replaced more roofs than originally expected and will be overrunning that reserve expense for the year. There are a few remaining end of year entries as we go through the auditing process for both operations and reserve.

At our January meeting, the Board approved using part of the excess operating funds to complete the venting of the roofs before the summer heat kicks in. The venting will take place in the Algonquian area and in the North section. We also approved using the remainder of the excess operating funds to begin replacing gutters. The scope of this project will be determined in the fall, and we will begin in the Biloxi/Buchanan area. More details will be provided once we get closer to the fall timeline.

To best serve our community, the Board finalized the managerial scope for the various areas of Board responsibility, including landscaping, irrigation, and building maintenance. Each area of responsibility has both a manager and an assistant manager. We will be introducing them at the next business meeting on April 29th. Please mark your calendar and join us at the meeting. This is the perfect time to bring your questions, requests or concerns for 2026 to the Board.

Communication is important to us, and you will be receiving periodic emails from the Board about projects that we

will be starting, as well as our monthly Village Voice in the magazine. We are currently gearing up to begin the painting project. Guidelines on what is painted and what is not were sent out in February to all the homeowners in the Winnipeg and Algonquian areas. We also resent the procedure for changing paint colors. If you did not receive this information, please contact the Hotline and we will send it to you. We do not have a firm start date at this time for the project, but we expect it to begin around the first week of May and continue into June.

Again, the Board meets monthly for working sessions on the last Wednesday of the month at 4:00 p.m. Our next Business meeting will be April 29 at 5:00 p.m. You are invited and encouraged to attend.

2026 HEBGC Master Board Election

Beginning with the 2012 HEBGC MBOD election, our association has used an electronic voting system provided by Vote-Now. Simply put, it reduces the expenses associated with preparing and mailing traditional paper ballots and streamlines the election process, including the vote count.

The official 2026 Election Day is Friday, April 17th.

All votes must be cast online or received as postal mail at Vote-Now's office by 12 Noon (Mountain Daylight time). There are one (1) – two (2) year term and two (2) – three (3) year term vacancies for the HEBGC Master Board.

An eligible voter must be a resident and on the Warranty Deed or part of a Family Trust etc. The voter's HOA account must be in good standing and must be current as of Friday, March 20, 2026. An account is considered in good standing when there are no past due HOA fees, special assessments, or fines imposed by the HOA.

Eligible voters who do not have internet access at their residence can vote using the Clubhouse computer, computers at a public library, ask a neighbor or call the Admin Office with your special code, and we can cast your vote for you. Voters who cannot or do not wish to use the electronic system can request a paper ballot mailed to their address on record.

Online voters receive an e-mail invitation in their designated e-mail account. **If your email address has changed recently, please contact the Admin Office at 720-235-1888 or email Jillian at JWyatt@heritageeaglebend.com to update it right away.** The invitation includes a link to www.vote-now.com's secure site with an embedded personal registration code. Once a ballot has been cast using this code, it cannot be re-used. When the link is clicked, the ballot automatically loads in a browser window. Clicking a candidate's name will show her/his biography. A verification screen shows the candidates chosen and an alert about any races in which no votes were cast. Voters can return to the ballot to make changes if necessary and submit their vote. A Vote-Now staff member acts as election administrator.

Paper ballots will be mailed by Vote-Now to voters who have not registered to vote electronically or those that don't have an email address on file with us. These voters will be required to send their ballots to Vote-Now via postal mail at their own expense. A message is included in the directions on the paper ballot specifying that if a ballot is cast electronically, the paper ballot will not be counted if it is mailed. When the paper ballots are received by Vote-Now, the election administrator will enter the voter's security code from the paper ballot and casts the vote by entering the code into the Vote-Now computer. The tallies are automatically made by the software, combining both paper and electronic votes. If the security code has already been used by the voter, the administrator will be notified and the voter will not be able to cast a vote a second time.





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What does Bill- 23-1161 change?

In 2023, Colorado passed House Bill 23-1161, which states that beginning **January 1, 2026**, all gas furnace installations in the state of Colorado must meet a minimum requirement of either ENERGY STAR® rated or Ultra Low NOx.

What does this mean for you?

Soon, simply replacing your current furnace with the same type will no longer be a viable option. Delaying this decision could result in costs that are two to three times higher. If you're uncertain about replacing your furnace, now is the perfect time to take action.

What's the good news?

There is a one-year grace period permitting continued gas furnace installation, but distributors are no longer receiving new shipments. Units can still be installed as long as existing supplies remain.

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ENERGY STAR® is a government-backed program that identifies products meeting high standards for energy efficiency, helping business and individuals save money and protect the environment. The label is awarded by the U.S. EPA and DOE to appliances, electronics, and building products that deliver superior energy performance. Since Colorado falls in the North region per ENERGY STAR® guidelines, this means the current minimum AFUE in Colorado is 95%; on July 31, 2026 it will increase to 97%AFUE

What is Ultra Low NOx (ULN)?

NOx is an abbreviation for nitrogen Oxide - a collection of greenhouse gasses that impact the environment. These gasses are released when fuel is burned at high heat like in an engine or gas furnace. Ultra-Low NOx refers to emission limits on nitrogen oxide, which cannot exceed 14 ng/J. In effort to lower greenhouse gas emissions, some areas are regulating the nitrous oxide (NOx) emissions of residential gas furnaces.



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
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
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
