President's Message

As we move into the summer season, I want to take a moment to address an important issue impacting our community—water use and conservation. The City of Aurora Water has implemented seasonal water restrictions in response to ongoing drought conditions across the region. These measures are designed to ensure long-term water availability, but they will also have visible effects throughout our community.



Residents should expect to see changes in how our shared spaces are maintained, including the golf course, park areas, and common landscaping. Turf areas may not appear as lush or green as in previous years, and some grass may naturally go dormant during periods of reduced irrigation. Our landscaping teams will continue to prioritize the health of the golf course and essential plantings, while adjusting watering schedules and practices in compliance with local regulations.

In addition, we want to inform residents that new golf cart guidelines will be introduced in the near future. These guidelines will limit usage to two carts per group of four players. Additional details will be shared soon. This update is intended to help preserve the condition of the golf course by reducing excessive wear and tear caused by cart traffic—especially important during drought conditions when turf is more vulnerable.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work together to navigate these challenges. By conserving water and being mindful of how we use our shared spaces, we can help maintain the beauty and long-term health of our community.

June settles in with longer days, warm evenings, and the unofficial start of ‘just a quick chat’ that turns into staying outside a while longer. Grills get some use, neighbors cross paths a little more often, and the pace feels just right. We’re fortunate to be part of the H-E-B community and proud of the easygoing, welcoming spirit within Traditions. Wishing everyone a relaxed, sunny, and enjoyable June.

FINANCIALS

The operating results (subject to audit) for March 2026 are complete. The year-to-date net result is an overrun of \$17,481 versus a planned budgeted overrun of \$18,523. This early in the year, there have been no major unanticipated expenses, and we remain better than budget. For March 2026, year-to-date reserve net income shows an overrun of \$75,708 vs a budgeted overrun of \$79,218. These overruns are expected this early in the year. The 2025 financial Audit is complete with no major issues. The audit can be found on the Traditions website.

LANDSCAPE

This summer will be very challenging as we work with our landscaping and irrigation vendors to address the extreme weather conditions this past winter. The city has mandated watering for only 2 days per week. Some of the considerations being discussed are chemical applications and height of the grass while mowing. Be assured we will try to make the correct decision within our budgetary constraints.

IRRIGATION

Aurora Water Department has initiated Draught State 1 mandate which requires a reduction of water usage by 20%. We are complying by reducing water which will result in brown yards throughout the community. We ask for your patience as we go through the summer.

The 92 homes with independent irrigation systems Environmental Designs (SaBells new name) set your clocks to comply with the mandate. You can check the time your system is running by using eyeonwater.com which is an app the city has made available to you.

PAINTING

With the final stages of painting for District 23 now complete, our homes have a fresh, updated look. Thank you to the painting crew for their hard work and to our homeowners for their cooperation in making this project a success. Debra’s able management of this service is commended by the board.

We hope you were encouraged to participate in everything that makes living in the Villages at HEB so wonderful. We discussed a variety of topics at the meeting including our current and anticipated financial position, water restrictions mandated by Aurora Water due to the drought, an update on our landscaping situation, and painting in the Winnipeg and Algonquian areas - which should finish this month. The painting project will, hopefully, be the last major capital project for several years. The Board will now focus on a plan to make changes and improvements to the landscaping. With hail season approaching, this is a good time to remind you to check your insurance policies and make sure you have an H06 or loss assessment clause included. As you know, insurance deductibles are shared equally by the homeowners, regardless of whether your property is the one sustaining the damage.

SUMMERTIME YARD MAINTENANCE AND EXTERIOR PROJECTS!

Summer is upon us, and here are several reminders!

Summer is here and we are all out and about sprucing up our homes and yards. Below is some helpful information on commonly asked questions regarding the warmer weather and keeping your home beautiful and well maintained:

Waterwise Landscaping – Waterwise landscaping is becoming more and more common. The city of Aurora is a great resource and can also help assist you with coming up with your new landscaping design. Please make sure to read through HEB’s Resident Improvement Guidelines for pre-approved designs and information on xeriscaping your property. A copy of the HEB RIGs can be found by logging into the resident only side of the website, selecting HOA/then Committee Reports/ then select Architectural Submittal/AAC.

Statues & Yard Art – Only one statue is permitted per front and back yard and cannot exceed 5 ft in height. All yard art requires prior approval from the AAC. Only 1 bird bath is permitted on any lot.

Exterior Storage – No storage is permitted on the exterior of the property. This includes lawn mowers, empty pots, ladders, gardening tools etc. Storage sheds and bins are also not permitted.

Mulch – Mulch breaks down over time and requires replenishment every 1-2 years. Make sure to take a look at your landscaping beds to see if they need a refresh of mulch.

Artificial Flowers - Artificial flowers, plants and trees are not permitted and may not be used in the landscaping or exterior decorations of homes.

Painting – If you are painting your single-family home, we have an Approved Color Paint Ring located in the Administration Building that you can borrow when choosing your home’s new colors. All paint projects require an AAC Submittal Form, even if residents are choosing a pre-approved color or painting the home in the previous paint color.

As a reminder, ALL exterior improvements require advanced approval before starting any work. This includes but is not limited to paint, roofs, decks, awnings, railings, landscape, fountains, hot tubs, patios, concrete projects, and all fencing. THE POOL IS OPEN!

The outdoor pool opened last month over the Memorial Day weekend. Here are some reminders for the upcoming 2026 pool season that you need to be aware of...

Please read the Rules below and the Pool / Spa / Sauna rules in the Rules & Regulations in their entirety.

Indoor and Outdoor Pool and Spa Rules:

1. ALL PERSONS USING POOLS AND SPA DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK.
2. Residents must have their Access ID Card with them.
3. **GUESTS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A RESIDENT. RESIDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR GUESTS AT ALL TIMES.**
4. No outside food or beverage is permitted. Food and beverages purchased from HEBGC may be consumed only in the Outdoor pool area.
5. No glass containers, breakable items or chewing gum.
6. No smoking.
7. No pets allowed.
8. Shower before entering pools or spa.
9. No person with communicable disease or skin, eye, ear, or nasal infections, open sores, vomiting, or diarrhea allowed in the pools or spa.
10. Swimsuits required to be worn at all times while in the pools, spa or Clubhouse. Cutoff shorts or other forms of street clothes are NOT acceptable swim attire. Swim diapers required for infants.
11. Personal audio systems permitted with individual earphones only.
12. Only small-sized pool items like kick boards, water shoes, water wings, fins, flippers, noodles, small tube blow ups, snorkels, and masks are permitted.
13. No private parties, unless previously authorized by Club Management.
14. No running, boisterous or rough play or diving. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others may result in person (s) being removed from the area as well as possible loss of pools / spa privileges for both the Residents and Guests.
15. **IMPORTANT:** Please report unsafe or objectionable behavior to the Welcome Desk either in person or 303-698-7788, **while it is happening.** A staff member will then be sent to the pool to observe the concern and take appropriate action. Please do not address concerns yourself.
16. **MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DENY USE TO ANYONE AT ANY TIME.**

Happy Summer Everyone! Genealogy Club is off for the summer, but we will return in September with our regular programs. For our summer newsletter series, our own Mary DeHay has written about Pedigree Collapse. Thank you, Mary!



Wouldn't it be interesting to find out how many ancestors we all have? To do that, we start with ourselves: one person. Double that to get two parents. Double that to get four grandparents. When we double that, we arrive at eight great-grandparents. And it keeps on going. When we double the number up to ten generations (about 300 years) we get a total of 1,024 ancestors. If we made a chart of these generations, it would have a pyramid shape with ourselves at the top. However, if we continue to trace ancestors, this pyramid concept doesn't survive because in only 33 more generations we would theoretically have more than eight billion ancestors—more than the number of people alive today! (International Society of Genetical Genealogy Wiki). Stay tuned for more next month.

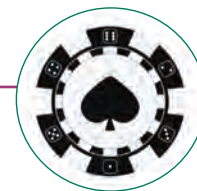

CAL News!! by Cindy Born-Mylo

Our numbers are in and once again HEB, you made this a successful Winter/Spring 2026 term! THANK YOU! We had 441 registrations for our 18 classes. We are now working on our Fall 2026 and Winter/Spring 2027 terms.



PLEASE NOTE:

Our Fall kickoff date is August 20, 2026, at 6 p.m. It was incorrect in the May newsletter.

With many new residents in HEB, we thought this would be a good time to explain about CAL. Our June & July newsletters will explain what CAL is and how it works while our August article is all about Kickoff, explaining our Intro to CAL PopUp on August 7 and Kickoff on August 20.

WHAT IS CAL?

CAL stands for Center for Active Learning, HEB's lifelong learning program. It is designed for residents who want to keep learning. We are an all-volunteer, community-based organization run by, with courses facilitated by, HEB residents.

We started out as part of DU's adult education program, Olli, when HEB was a new development. As HEB grew, many residents became interested in teaching/facilitating classes so, we broke away from OLLI and CAL was born.

WHO RUNS CAL?

A "Lead Team" governs CAL which consists of a Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, Facilitator Lead, Publicity, A/V Lead, Registrar, and Curriculum Lead. The current members of the lead team are profiled on our website calheb.org. Just click on the About CAL tab.

What educational opportunities are there?

CAL offers two types of learning programs: Courses and PopUps.

Courses are held during two terms – Winter/Spring (February through April) and Fall (September through October) – and typically last about 4 weeks. They cover a wide range of topics such as games, world history, discussion-led courses, and arts & crafts. Registration takes place during our twice a year Kickoff events – August for Fall and January for Winter/Spring. Cost is \$10.

Our one-time PopUp classes usually "PopUp" in the summer or when CAL courses are not offered. These free, 1–2-hour classes explore a variety of topics.
